The heat yesterday was most oppressive, the thermometer marking 90 in the shade. Owing to the pipe-water breakdown our Indian screens were useless.

Madame Bremon, Countess of Valentini, returns to Europe immediately with the intention of engaging a dramatic company to perform at the Argentine Theatre.

There was unusual excitement in Calle Bolivar on Wednesday. Along that street, far as the naked or spectacled eye could reach, were ranged all the water carts in the city, while their owners pressed into the Water-works Office to 'interview' Mr. Dawson or the Committee on the great question of the day.

The noise in the street from the jingling of the bells on the water carts was so tremendous that, even inside, 'hearing one's ears' was a difficult matter, and our reporter could not take a note of the speeches. A burly Gallego, who began with 'Caspieta!' and ended with the same expression, represented that though he was unaccustomed to public speaking, he knew that two and two make four, and that 'no hay agua porque no hay agua' wouldn't do for the watermen; there was no pipe water for the carts, so they (the water carriers) must be allowed to go to the river for it, 'caspieta!'

Contrary to all rule, the deputacion gave a cheer that made both the welkin and the bells on the carts ring, and shortly afterwards withdrew with a promise that their case should receive every consideration. We understand that permission has been granted the watermen to take water, until Mr. Bateman's suggestions are carried out, from the river.

We are at present putting Mr. Bateman's report on the port in type, Governor Castro having courteously sent it to us for publication. It will be ready for the Hipparchus mail of the 9th prox., and all our subscribers are entitled to a copy gratis.

Last Sunday at the Tigre visitors who went up the Lujan in boats were disgusted and horrified at seeing the dead body of a man tied to a stake or branch in the river. We understand the authorities were informed of the circumstance early in the day but, of course, took no notice. The corpse is most probably there still, but we trust measures will be taken to remove it ere next Sunday. The effect such a sight might have on a boat full of ladies can be imagined.

In the South all the young men are raving from the description. From a single partido 500 have gone to join the Indians for a time in their 'tolderias.'

General Conesa is daily expected in town from Sta. Fe.

A vessel has just arrived from the States with 70 volumes of English books for the use of some of the schools in this country. The names of these works are published. Amongst them is the report of some insurance company, and a good many others, the utility of which to the young Argentine idea it is difficult to discern.

Cordoba is not content with gold, copper, and coal discoveries, but is now 'going in' for topazes, a mine of which is said to have been lately discovered at Tulumba by a Mr. Rosario Lejas.—The stones are of the yellow variety, the least valuable.

Our friend Bullrich has some splendid chromo-lithographs on view, and which he will sell by auction in a few days. Connoisseurs should not miss this opportunity.

The death of Don José M. Dominguez, ex-Governor of the Province of Entre Rios, is announced; he expired at his residence in Gualeguaychú.

On Wednesday Viscount Branco, Minister Borges and a number of distinguished Brazilian gentlemen were entertained at dinner by Sr. Lisboa, Brazilian Consul General to the Argentine Republic.

BOLSA IMPROVEMENTS.
The following letter from Mr. Rom to Messrs. Stamp & Co. of Montevideo appears in their circular of 21st inst.

Buenos Ayres, Jan. 12th.
Gentlemen,
I have to thank you for your flattering allusion to me when speaking of the Bolsa of Buenos Ayres and the enlargement of our premises. The idea you suggest was started by me two years ago, and would have been carried out but for the opposition of some narrow-minded people who did not understand their own interests. The Bolsa was so small and the number of members increasing so rapidly that I got up a Joint Stock Co. for the construction of a vast and commodious edifice, to afford room not only for an Exchange, but also for a Tribunal of Commerce, and a grand mercantile Club, the capital was four millions (£32,000). At the same time I submitted a bill to the Legislature, of which I was then a member, to authorize the Municipality to sell us a few pieces of ground alongside the Government house in Plaza 25 de Mayo, which would have exactly suited for the proposed edifice. With the money we should pay them for the site in question they could purchase the Re-

coba Vieja and pull it down, so as to throw the two Plazas, Victoria and 25 de Mayo, into one grand square, 8 acres in extent. The present Boles would be converted into a Post-office, for which I had arranged with Mr. Posadas, Post-master General; and the latter actually got permission from the National Government to purchase it. Nevertheless all my efforts fell through, owing to the opposition of those who said 'we were well enough where we were,' without regarding the inconvenience of crowding all the merchants of the city into such confined premises for several hours every day.

FORGERIES IN MONTEVIDEO.
Sir,
In to-day's *Telegrafo Marítimo* the public is warned that forged twenty dollars Maná notes, new emission, are in circulation, the perceptible difference being that the false ones are lighter in colour than the genuine ones, and that the former do not bear the name of the lithographer under the 'figura.'

The exceeding coarseness of the execution of the impression would almost seem by the facility it offers to invite fraudulent attempts at imitations, and you may rely upon it that they will be largely made, to the loss of the public in the first instance although Messrs. Maná will ultimately be far more considerably prejudiced by the existence of the forgeries. After once having been victimised one will be chary of accepting Messrs. Maná's doubtful notes and their circulation cannot but suffer both in amount and extension.

Would the expense of replacing the notes of the 'New Emission' by others more elaborately executed and more difficult of imitation be such that Messrs. Maná would consider it outweighed the advantage it would purchase of security for the public against fraud, and increased confidence in their notes, with the accompanying result of an increased and wider circulation.

I do not think Messrs. Maná will be of this opinion and their old notes strengthen me in this conviction.

FRENCH PRISONERS.
The *North German Gazette* states that the prisoners taken in the sortie of the 29th, included many soldiers above 40 years of age, who had gone through the Crimean, Italian, and Mexican campaigns. They described the service in the trenches, of which some of them had nearly three months' experience, as extremely fatiguing, and complained of the unequal distribution of military duties, as the Mobs, mostly cantoned between the forts and the walls, can go into Paris without any difficulty, while the troops of the active army have been consigned to the forts for nearly two months, with scarcely any interruption. They made no complaint as to food, for although according to their statements, the meat rations, of late consisting only of horseflesh and salted fish, have for some time been reduced from 200 grammes (two-fifths of a pound) to 150 grammes, other articles, especially bread and wine, were increased in a corresponding degree. The sortie, like all warlike items, was only announced to the soldiers a few hours previously. The people in the district south of Paris passed the 30th in great excitement. On St. Germain's terrace especially, which affords an extensive view over the fortifications of Paris up to Montmartre and St. Denis, groups of hundreds of men of all classes formed, pouring from the neighbouring villages. The people are beginning to see that the obstinate resistance of the Parisians is splendid

THE LATE WILLIAM C. THOMPSON.
The announcement of Mr. Thompson's death will cause widespread regret. Few Englishmen who have visited these shores enjoyed a wider circle of friends than Mr. Thompson, who came to the Plate a boy, about the year 1825, and having spent some of the best years of his life in mercantile pursuits, returned to his native land in the year 1866. The firm of J. C. Thompson and Co., of which the subject of this memoir was, on the death of his brother James, the senior partner, is one of the oldest English houses in the Plate. It was started in the most unpretending manner in the premises adjoining Mr. Tay's office in Calle Reconquista, about the year 1825, by the brother's Thompson both of whom are now gathered to their fathers, and for nearly half a century has maintained a leading position in our mercantile world.

Mr. Thompson was a resident of this country for over forty years, and won himself the esteem and respect of Argentines by his upright and honorable conduct during the many political crises which have chequered its history. In fact, we may say that few English names are so endeared to Argentines as that of Thompson, as was testified by the ovation on the mole at his departure.

Mr. Thompson died of apoplexy in his 66th year.

The deferred dividends on the recently issued Municipal Bonds will not be paid before the 31st inst. No date is as yet fixed for the amortization.

The suspension of well known dry-goods dealer in Montevideo was announced; liabilities 300,000 patacones, assets not supposed to be favorable.

A quantity of Silver ore from San Juan was discharged to-day alongside the Bolas, and will be forwarded by next steamer to Europe.
Mr. Ed. Engort has opened his office as a com-estible broker at No. 33 Calle Piedad.
The death of Mr. William Thompson, so long a prominent merchant of Buenos Ayres, has spread a gloom in commercial circles. The melancholy intelligence was telegraphed to Lisbon just in time to catch the steamer. Mr. Thompson died at Liverpool in alluent circumstances, and it is probable that his eldest son will carry on the business of the house, which is second to none in the Plate.
Captain John Page has concluded an arrangement with the Immigration Society for the landing of all immigrants for the current year at the rate of 10 dollars per head. The contract is a highly important one, and will probably amount to more than is anticipated, as, owing to the disturbed state of Europe, emigration to the Plate is now assuming gigantic proportions. There are over 550 immigrants in the Asylum at present, notwithstanding that 450 were taken yesterday for the Suachales colony. Captain Page's line of little steamers, running between the mole and the outer roads, is now doing good service. On last Sunday over 1000 immigrants were landed on the mole—strongly healthy, hard working people, nearly all agriculturists. Most of them go up the country, for in town there is no employment for such masses.
