ed to take it. When it appears in Europe or other temperate climate it rarely holds beyond the summer and autumn, attacking natives and foreigners indistinctly, except strangers who have come from the tropics.

"It makes more ravages among whites than colored people. Men and adults of a vigorous constitution are more exposed than others, especially if they take much animal food or ardent spirits; fatigue, vexation or excitement should be avoided.

"The medical world is divided as to whether it be contagious or not. Oberlin, Dalmas, Devez, Valentin and Raeh assert that it is not, and say this is the reason it is not imported to Europe from the West Indies. They consider it as a malady of a local nature depending on a focus more or less circumscribed.

"The method to avoid Yellow Fever is this—to remove from unhealthy localities to a high, dry and well-ventilated neighborhood. Those people who have to remain in infected districts must be very regular in eating and drinking, and avoid bleeding, purgatives or emetics.

"Vessels arriving from infected ports should be fumigated, and the crew sent to a lazaretto for some days. If a street become infected all the houses should at once be vacated and the occupants if possible kept apart from the rest of the townfolk.

"In our case the first thing to be done is what the Municipality has just ordered, to clear out the infected neighborhood, and then take up the Riachuelo seriously, for if not, the consequences cannot be predicted."

Our surprise, at an attendance more respectable for individual position than general numbers, was somewhat relieved by the Secretary reading a protest signed by two members of the committee declaring the meeting illegal, on the ground that sufficient publicity had not been given, the notices, which according to the by-laws of the society should have appeared for eight days in two of the chief city papers, receiving only 7 publications.

Mr. Krabbe—Very exact. The Chairman—It is not necessary the meeting should be a legal one to ascertain the feeling of the majority.

Mr. Niebuhr said that the plea of illegality was a mere pretext of the opposition, for the committee were at the first resolved to hold the meeting on the 1st inst., but Messrs MacKinlay and Thompson, who now protested, were the very first to insist on this evening.

Mr. Krabbe thought that under the circumstances the best thing to do was to take the spirit of the meeting and call another legally for an early day.

Mr. Isaac expressed himself perfectly in accordance with this view of the case, and called on the chairman to adjourn the meeting.

Mr. Arming.—There is no objection to calling another meeting, if you will all promise to attend; otherwise, the opposition, who have absented themselves, would have it all their own way.

Mr. Isaac. The question is in a nutshell. Is the meeting legal or illegal? If, as I believe it to be, informal, then the sooner we dissolve it the better. (Mr. Niebuhr interrupts the speaker.)

Chairman.—Well then, gentlemen, before we go, let us have an expression of opinion; let us feel the pulse of the assembly. Is the institution to be carried on as formerly, or not? Let those in the affirmative rise.

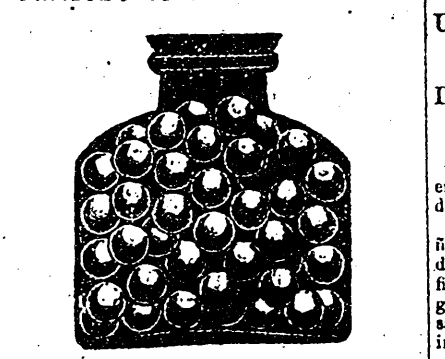
