THE WHITEWASH EDICT.

The Municipality has published a milk-and-water edict inviting house- holders to whitewash their premises.

The peculiar tone of the notice in question shows that the Corporation doubts either the sanitary qualities of lime or their own jurisdiction to com- pel the people to whitewash.

The language of the notice is as fol- lows:—

The Municipality, in accordance with the advice of the Board of Health, notifies the public of the importance and necessity of at once whitewashing the interior and exterior of their pre- mises, recommending them most par- ticularly to lose no time in adopting a measure so beneficial to the public health, as also that of each individual householder, during the present epi- demic.

That such a notice will ever get even the fronts of the houses whitewashed very much question. To effect a general whitewashing the city must be divided into fifty districts, each district superintended by an inspector, whose duty must be to go from house to house and see the work done; supplying lime to those unable to purchase it, and fining every holder who, within one week, fails to comply with the edict, if the object of the Municipality is really to get the town whitewashed, this is the only way to effect it; and, 'eu passant,' we may add that the effect of good example might also be tried: in the Cabildo, Policia, National and Provincial Government-houses, markets, and, above all, the municipal school- houses, commissary offices in the dif- ferent districts, and juzgados, should at once be whitewashed. Let the Mu- nicipality begin themselves, and show the people they are in earnest; and we demand of Messrs. Martinez de Hoz, Sassenberg, Livingstone, and others, that they obey the spirit of their own invitation, and lose no time, but com- mence the week with a whitewash brush in the hands of every policeman at the different comisarías throughout the city.

Three years have now elapsed since public attention was first turned to the health of the city. During the awful visitation of the cholera some few measures were adopted of a hi- gienic character; but as soon as the plague left us the Municipality fell back into its ancient slough of neglect, and since 1868 we have witnessed the decay and growth of a new nuisance, termed 'conventillos.' Within the last week disclosures have been made which show that the very pigs down in Barracas are quartered better than the impoverished labouring classes which now flood our shores.

In a dung-built hovel near Plaza Libertad, 10x20—a tenement house built more like a human corral than anything else—300 human beings sleep each night: worse even than the Black Hole of Calcutta; for the stifled occupants paid not only part of their life-blood for the accommodation, but, furthermore, a paper dollar for the shelter. Gracious Heavens! Do we live in a Christian land? THERE ARE OVER FIVE HUNDRED SUCH NIGHT- CORRALS IN THIS CITY; and, worse still, we are told these 'conventillos' are springing up in every direction, being found to be the best paying pro- perty in town!!!

How the unfortunate people survive a night in such holes it is impossible to conceive; we all know the necessity of ventilation—that every full-grown healthy being requires to imbibe, for the purpose of physical subsistence, about one gallon of pure air per min- ute, or sixty gallons every hour, and as the air once breathed is unfitted for being breathed a second time, it is essential that in every dwelling care- ful provision should be made for the removal of the vitiated air, and the admission of pure air in its stead.

The 'conventillos' built in this city are constructed purely with a view of accommodating the greatest possible number of tenants and gaining most rent. Built on the ground, with earth- en floors mud-brick walls, and com- mune plastering, they are literally pest-houses of the very worst stamp. They are especially noxious to life, for carbonic acid gas, which is very poison- ous, is mixed with the atmosphere; and the removal of this gas is difficult, owing to its density being greater than the common air, and its tendency to gravitate into the lowest parts. Such has been the experience of one of the most skilled epidemic doctors of the day, Dr. Harris, of New York, who in one week levelled every inhabited house in that immense city, in fifteen days

had every house and wall in the gigan- tic metropolis of the Union whitewash- ed, and in less than 30 days had the worst epidemic known to the human race effectually stamped out.

With the lime brush and the police- man's baton Dr. Harris saved New York, and that not half a century ago, but only a couple of years past. He wot that was time—time—time. Give me lime, he said, and I give you health. And he carried out his promise to the letter.

Without drainage, without sewerage or internal or external cleanliness, it is really a mystery how Buenos Ayres has escaped so well as it has up to the present. The tide of emigration now keeps steadily flowing to the Plate. The Buenos Ayres of to-day is immeasurably different to the Buenos Ayres of even five years ago; and now we require the most rigid higienic measures to save the hitherto healthiest city in the world from becoming the plague-spot of South America.

The following order by the Board of Health is to the point, and we com- mend it to the attention of our read- ers.

The Board of Health has decided to expend the sum of 2 millions voted by the Provincial Government, in carry- ing out the following measures:—

1st. To establish a Lazaretto for the poor and sick and patients from the prisons and hospitals that may be at- tacked with yellow fever.

2nd. To provide lodgings for poor people obliged to leave infected man- zanas, and feed them as long as may prove necessary.

3rd. To adopt measures for carrying out the basura service as completely as possible.

4th. To clean out house cess-pools by the Atmospheric system, especially in those manzanas where cases of yellow fever occur.

5th. To use disinfectants freely in such houses as the Atmospheric sys- tem cannot be employed in.

6th. To reduce the number of occu- pants in 'conventillos,' and give the apartments plenty of air and light, as also sufficient room for court-yards.

7th. To visit the prisons, hospitals and barracks and carry out similar improvements.

8th. To clean and water the streets regularly.

9th. To keep strict watch on the markets and killing-grounds.

10th. To establish a special washing- house for the clothes of fever patients from lazarettoes and private houses, after such clothes have been disin- fected.

The Patagonia arrived early yester- day at Montevideo with Lisbon dates to the 6th inst. The confirmation of the news per South is complete. Paris has fallen, and terms for a general peace have been proposed; they are so terribly onerous for France, however that it is doubtful if they will be ac- cepted. Another deluge of misfor- tunes seems to have fallen on France, Bourbaki having retreated to Switzer- land and laid down his arms almost simultaneously with the fall of the cap- ital. Our telegrams state that peace is doubtful. The armistice of 21 days in Barracas are quartered better than the impoverished labouring classes which now flood our shores.

In a dung-built hovel near Plaza Libertad, 10x20—a tenement house built more like a human corral than anything else—300 human beings sleep each night: worse even than the Black Hole of Calcutta; for the stifled occupants paid not only part of their life-blood for the accommodation, but, furthermore, a paper dollar for the shelter. Gracious Heavens! Do we live in a Christian land? THERE ARE OVER FIVE HUNDRED SUCH NIGHT- CORRALS IN THIS CITY; and, worse still, we are told these 'conventillos' are springing up in every direction, being found to be the best paying pro- perty in town!!!

How the unfortunate people survive a night in such holes it is impossible to conceive; we all know the necessity of ventilation—that every full-grown healthy being requires to imbibe, for the purpose of physical subsistence, about one gallon of pure air per min- ute, or sixty gallons every hour, and as the air once breathed is unfitted for being breathed a second time, it is essential that in every dwelling care- ful provision should be made for the removal of the vitiated air, and the admission of pure air in its stead.

The 'conventillos' built in this city are constructed purely with a view of accommodating the greatest possible number of tenants and gaining most rent. Built on the ground, with earth- en floors mud-brick walls, and com- mune plastering, they are literally pest-houses of the very worst stamp. They are especially noxious to life, for carbonic acid gas, which is very poison- ous, is mixed with the atmosphere; and the removal of this
