DRAINAGE AND WATER-SUPPLY.

The Provincial Government has just published a pamphlet by Don Jayme Arrafo, C.E., on this subject, which will be read with interest at the present moment. It is not so exhauslive in details, or precise in the items of work to be done, expenditure, &c., as the essay of Mr. Coghlan in 1869. Nevertheless, there are many things worthy of note, and sundry quotations from the highest scientific authorities of England and France which show that Mr. Arruió has made long and

deep researches in the matter. From the foundation of B. Ayres in 1580 down to the outbreak of the cholera in 1867 the inhabitants procured their supply of water either from the river or from cisterns. Mr. Arruto quotes Professor Puiggari and Dr. Frankland of Oxford as authorities that the River Plate water is much purer than that of the Seine, Thames, or Rhone, and only equalled by the Loire or Garonne. The analysis by Frankland was made in October 1869, but we may feel certain the water was not taken under circumstances when the river was full of dead fish as high as Palermo.

The present water-works laid down through the city extend over sixty miles: the tank in Plaza Lorea holds 500 pipes, and stands 155 feet over the level of the river. The daily consumption sometimes reaches 5000 pipes, say twenty litres per head of the inhabitants. The supply of the various cities Southern, Dufty, J. In London the drains are not so large, but it is admitted that even have attended unless prohibited by the poorest quarters of the city are admirably drained, and M. Freycinet says the improvement of the climate is marvellous; the cost to the citizens is about 11 per cent, on the capital (say 31d in the pound steriing), and the total cost of the works will be paid off in forty years.

In Mr. Arrufo's pamphlet we have no statistics as to the cost or length of time requisite for the proposed works in Buenos Ayres. Mr. Coghlan's estimate is £943,000, the works to be concluded in two or three years. It appears, however, that Mr. Bateman puts down the cost at £1,600,000 and that at least 20 years will be requisite to carry out the works.
