Address from British residents at M ball on the night of 16th March 1871. "Your Royal Highness,

"The British residents in Montal deo have requested me to state, their name, that they rejoice to he the present auspicious opportunity presenting to Your Royal Highner their most respectful compliments.

"They regret that the short tay which Your Royal Highness is to make in this city has prevented them from according to you a reception and entertainment more worthy of your distinguished position, and of the loyal affection which they bear you as the son of our beloved Queen.

"They nevertheless trust that the little they have been able to offer, and the cordial feeling which actuates them, will not be displeasing to Your Royal Highness, and that you will accord the distinguished favor of bearing to Her Most Gracious Majesty the Queen the expression of their loyal devotion.

"To Your Royal Highness they offer their warmest sentiments of affection and esteem, and they heartily pray that your visit here may be followed by a prosperous voyage to England and a happy reunion with your Royal fa-

The Prince's answer, delivered verbally, was as follows:-

"I have to thank the British resi dents heartily for the kindness with which I have been personally received by them, and the loyal sentiments which have been exhibited towards the Queen, as testified in the handsome reception you have accorded me; and I beg to state that on my arrival in England I shall have the greatest pleasure in assuring Her Majesty the Queen that the feeling of loyalty towards her person is equal among the British subjects in Montevideo to that I have experienced in any part of the world.

"I beg again to thank you." The Prince retired from the ball at three, and re-embarked at two p.m. on


