THE NEW LOAN.

The Argentine loan for Public Works just negotiated in London is the largest transaction of the kind in the history of this country.

with that has always characterized the national finances; all these causes combined have begun to show fruit in the happy result of the new Argentine loan.

Coming at so opportune a period, when a commercial crisis threatened to follow quickly on the steps of the plague, we do not exaggerate in saying that the successful conclusion of the loan is the most joyful piece of news we have had for years.

It is, however, to be regretted that all this amount of treasure is destined to be expended on works of secondary importance, while the great purpose which we should all hold in view is completely forgotten.

The welfare and progress of the Republic depend more immediately on the city of Buenos Ayres than on the combined interests of all the upper Provinces.

We may expect a storm of indignation from the people of the Upper Provinces who have so long sighed for railways.

The damage caused to Buenos Ayres by the Yellow Fever has been immense; the Republic estimates the depreciation of house-property at seven thousand millions, which is, however, a slight exaggeration.

Buenos Ayres represents 5-sixths of the wealth, intellect, and trade of the Republic; it also pays 5-sixths of the taxes.

Yesterday the Montevideo Water Works (an enterprise of stupendous magnitude for those countries) were completed, and the first 'horror' of water from the valley of the Santa Lucia was thrown into the Queen City of the Plate amidst the indescribable joy of the inhabitants.

show Paris is a city not easily to be taken. The entry of the army of Versailles is looked forward to by many a beating heart with that feverish expectation with which the coming of the Campbells was expected to relieve Lucknow.

The people of Montevideo have now a water supply to be only classed with the Vartry water works of Dublin. The limpid waters of the Santa Lucia are now brought over hill and dale to the city of Montevideo.

On Sunday morning, the 2nd, the first blood of the civil war was shed. It will be a date never to be forgotten and ever to be recalled.

There are no more postage stamps to buy—no commercial stamps are wanted; the receipts from the 'octroi' are uncertain; the railways keep their cash, on the principal of no pay no 'pater noster.'

It is useless now discussing the Commune. It is force against force. It had many things to recommend it so long as it had a municipal aim; and had the Assembly acted in a conciliatory spirit, the present unhappy antagonism might have been avoided.

But the new War Minister 'ad interim,' General Cluserot, will no longer allow such men to halt between two opinions.

There is not much chance for dame Liberty, in embracing her the admirers seem to kill her. The journals are suppressed with a rapidity that the fallen empire could not surpass.

During the recent fighting the guards often wanted ammunition, and having no firewood, had to eat their meat raw.

Since the Church of the Pantheon has been 'purified,' by having its cross made into a flag staff for the 'dragoon rouge, the God of Battles does not seem to be propitiated in the least.

The death of Florens has clouded the Federals. In case the Commune carries its bill, the whole bill, and nothing but the bill, his remains will be the first lodged in the Pantheon.

The agitation is increasing to have the proceedings of the Commune open to the public. Vested as the members of it are with such extensive powers, their acts cannot be known too soon.

The increased traffic on the Northern and Great Southern Railways of Buenos Ayres appears from the January returns published in the London papers.

The 'Frog-Thinkers' have had their 'full meat' banquet on Good Friday, to vex the clergy, as if the latter were not sufficiently in purgatory by the decree abolishing the connection between Church and State.

One comfortable event occurred yesterday—the guillotine was publicly burned, and by an appropriate compliment, on the place Voltaire, in honor of the philosopher who laughed at the efficacy of death punishment.

An express train went down to Versailles yesterday, displaying two enormous white flags. Rumor states the measure was connected with overtures for peace.

The epidemic showed a further satisfactory decrease on Friday, the number of deaths caused by it being only 19, the lowest figure yet reached since its decline set in.

We heard rumors yesterday of there being some news from Rio Cuarto in town relative to the Indians. We intend, however, for the future to follow the example of that illustrious optimist, Mr. Mark Tapley, and, eschewing disagreeable topics, look at everything from a pleasant point of view.

Many people have been comparing the present epidemic with the Plague of London, and the mortality in proportion seems about the same.

It was on that occasion that Juan Alonzo Gonzalez (a native of Cadiz) founded the orphanage of San Miguel, subsequently removed to the Mercad.

The furniture vans are now doing a brisk business, everybody moving somewhere. There never before has been seen such a general change of tenements, and in many cases the tenants cannot find their landlords.

It is thought there will be no festive demonstration on the 25th this year. 'Tant mieux.' National anniversaries make away with a good deal of money, which we trust this year to see devoted to the relief of the misery caused by the plague, instead of being squandered in tom foolery for the amusement of the multitude.

General O'Connell while in the Campagna got together a flock of sheep for the Omission Popular; the flock reached town yesterday.

The wooden pavement now being laid down for a square in Calle Victoria looks as if it would answer; at all events, it is an improvement on the 'pavement' of paving we have suffered from so long.

The orphans made by the epidemic went in a body to the Provincial Government House on Friday, accompanied by the members of the special commission appointed to look after them.

ENSENADA.

The natural harbour of Ensenada owes its existence to an extensive tract of marsh land, covered at high water by the tide which pours in from the River Plate through four or five openings.

It appears obvious that the natural advantages of this place as a harbour may be greatly improved by art of the simplest kind.

Firstly, By blocking up the smaller openings, the rush of water through the principal one will be increased.

Secondly, By dredging at the bar, the tendency of the increased rush of water to widen rather than to deepen will be in some measure obviated.

Thirdly, By strengthening the banks at the mouth of the large opening, so as to prevent a widening of it, a tendency to an increase of depth in proportion to the increase of the rush of water would be caused.

Fourthly, By cutting away the reeds and trees which grow in the marsh, to gether with the soil above low water mark, the harbour might be made capable of containing an increased body of water at high tide.

Fifthly, A careful observation of the tidal currents into and from the harbour, and the natural formation of the banks resulting from the junction of the ebb stream with that of the R. Plate, a situation in the direction of Point Lara might be selected for the formation of a breakwater for the purpose of sheltering the mouth of the harbour, and to keep the ebb stream compact, so as to prevent the formation of a bar between the harbour and the deep part of the River Plate.

Without this breakwater, the harbour might be found sufficiently sheltered and accessible.

It might be desirable to open a wide communication between the harbour and the marsh which lies between the present town of Ensenada and the high ground further inland, so as to increase the accumulation of water at high tide.

THE VARELA LOAN.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, I, MARIANO VARELA, the Commissioner duly authorized by powers conferred on me by his Excellency the President of the Argentine Republic, send greeting.

Whereas, by a law of the Congress of the said Republic, of the 2nd (6th) August, 1870, the Executive Power of the said Republic was authorized to contract an interior or exterior loan for a sum not exceeding thirty millions of hard dollars (pesos fuertes) nominal value, in Bonds of the Public Debt, bearing interest at 6 per cent. per annum and with an accumulating sinking fund of 2 1/2 per cent. per annum for redeeming the Bonds by lot and par, and by the said law it was provided that the said Loan should be issued at the best price to be obtained, and in conformity with the instructions given by the Executive Power, and that payment of the said Loan should be guaranteed by the general revenues of the nation, and especially by the proceeds of the 5 per cent. additional import duties, and the 2 per cent. export duties payable in the National Customs Houses as soon as the loans contracted with the Provincial Bank of Buenos Ayres, to the repayment of which the said duties were then appropriated, should be redeemed, and that the principal and interest of the said Loan should be exempt from all taxes on the part of the National Government, and that out of the net proceeds of the said Loan certain sums mentioned in the law should be strictly applied to the following objects, that is to say:—The payment of the loans made by the Provincial Bank of Buenos Ayres; the construction, on account of the nation, of railway from Villa Nueva to Rio Cuarto, the extension of the Railway from Cordoba to Tucuman, the construction of the works of the Port and Custom-house Warehouses at the city of Buenos Ayres, the construction of wharfs and Custom-house warehouses at the city of Rosario.

And whereas by a power of attorney, dated the 27th October 1870, under the hand and seal of his Excellency Don Domingo Faustino Sarmiento, the President of the said Republic, I was appointed the Special Agent to negotiate the said Loan, and the fullest powers were given to me for the purpose of proceeding in the name of the Government of the Argentine Republic, according to the said law and according to the terms and conditions therein contained, to negotiate for the issue of the whole of the said Loan, and to sign and issue the General Bond and the Special Bonds corresponding thereto, which should be held valid and lawful, and should give a right to the funds created by the said Law, and to the receipt of the interest payable in respect thereof, and to redemption by means of the sinking fund provided for that purpose, to the payment whereof the Argentine Republic thereby bound itself according to the terms of the said Law; and by the said power I was authorized to name a house which should have the charge of paying broad the interest of the loan half-yearly, and of effecting the gradual redemption of the capital, and to do everything which should be conducive to the better fulfilment of the mission with which I was charged, notwithstanding express mention was not made thereof in the said powers.

And whereas I have appointed Messrs. C. de Murrieta and Co., of London, the agents of the Government of the said Republic, for the purpose of issuing the said Loan, and afterwards paying the interest and sinking fund thereof.

Now, know ye that I, in the name of the Argentine Republic and the Government thereof by virtue of the before mentioned powers, and all other powers conferred upon me by the said Government, do by these presents declare that the Government of the said Republic has contracted an Exterior Loan for six millions one hundred and twenty-two thousand four hundred pounds sterling (£6,122,400), being the equivalent of the said sum of 30,000,000 hard dollars, represented by bonds of 1000, 500, 200, and 100 pounds sterling each, up to and subject to the following conditions:—

First. The said bonds shall bear interest from the 1st March 1871, at 6 per cent. per annum, payable half-yearly, upon presentation of the coupons, on the 1st March and 1st September of each year; the first payment to be made on the 1st September, 1871.

Second. Thirteenth: The payment of the principal and interest of the said Bonds is guaranteed according to the said law by the general revenues of the nation, and especially by the proceeds of the duties mentioned in the said law.

And know ye further that I, as such Agent, and by virtue of the power aforesaid, do hereby bind and obligate the said Argentine Republic, and the Government thereof, to the due and punctual payment of the principal and interest of the said Bonds, pursuant to the terms and conditions aforesaid, and to all other respects of all and every form of the said terms and conditions.

There was a very good attendance on 'Change' to-day, better even than yesterday, and nearly all the brokers and merchants have now returned to town. To-day was a sort of preliminary day on 'Change. Monday business begins.

To-day there was nothing done in the wool markets; in the dry hide market a small lot of dry hides at 150 m/c.

The conduct of the National Finance Minister and the Directors of the Provincial Bank in postponing the payment for sixty days of all Custom House bills that have matured during the feria is much spoken of. It is considered one of the best helping measures the Government and the Bank could adopt at the moment, and will liberate fully one and a-half million of patacons, which otherwise would have to be taken from the market. Mr. Dominguez with this step has established increased claims on the commerce of Buenos Ayres, and the National Government will be no losers by the measure.

Exchange was done on England to-day at 61 to 64; on Antwerp at 5.30, 6.35 and 6.38. We give all the above rates, as there is really no official rate for this market. A pretty brisk business was done to-day on credit, and about £60,000 sterling in all passed, which may be considered about one-third of the regular exchange business for the English market.

The amortization of the Bustamante loan took place on Friday at the Public Office. The following were the numbers drawn:—

We have again to notify the commercial public that all bills, payable, etc. not renewed or arranged on Monday will be protested on Tuesday morning.

The following are the latest Box of Trade returns from England, received per Aricaucita. They are significant and worthy of study:—

The Board of Trade returns for March were issued to-day. The total declared value of our exports in that month was £20,074,600, against £17,300,210, in the corresponding period of 1870 showing an increase of £2,774,390. Trade appears, therefore, to be rapidly recovering from the depression arising from the recent war. The increase has been chiefly in silk, apparel and cloths, cotton manufactures, fire arms, cotton (yarn and twist), earthenware and porcelain, haberdashery and millinery, iron and steel, leather, linen and jute, jute manufactures, seed oil, saddlery and harness, silk manufactures, wool, and woollen and worsted manufactures. On the other hand, beer and ale, copper, hardware and cutlery, linen manufactures, and silk exhibit a decrease. The imports in March amounted to £26,697,995, against £23,107,911 in 1870. The imports of wheat were valued at £1,629,798, against £1,066,761, and the imports of cotton at £5,461,168, against £4,031,056.
