"As usual much noise was made about the Saladeros, the smell from the Riochuelo becoming insupportable; but even the water of the River Plate was just as bad, and yet 100,000 people had to use it daily."

"Still the number of Italian immigrants was 100 per diem, and these were crowded into the 600 conventicles of the city where persons of this class find food and lodging for \$5 (10d.) per day. In some of these places we found people sick of the fever who had a stretcher by night and lay on the floor by day, the stretcher being rented out to two persons in the 24 hours."

"The plague did not prevent Carnival being celebrated as usual, although the Board of Health declared that all groning of people was unwholesome. The week after Carnival we had a great increase both of new cases and deaths, although up to this there was hardly a case outside of San Tolmo."

"In March the epidemic spread so fiercely that the authorities woke up from their lethargy, established a Lazaretto, and appointed parish doctors and apothecaries. The Comision Popular was also instituted, and provided physicians, nurses, &c., for each district. By this time the plague knocked at almost every door in the city; 100,000 of the citizens had fled, leaving only 80,000 of the poorer classes. The returns of deaths this month rose from 44 to 337, shewing a total of 4,992."

"April was still worse, the mortality rising every day, and 30,000 more persons fled from town, some dying out in the camp, having taken the seeds of the epidemic, but nowhere did the people of the little towns take the contagion."

"The highest number of deaths published was on Easter Monday (April 10th) viz., 603, but by the end of the month it fell to 85: total monthly return—7,564."

"In the beginning of May, the figures again rose above 100, but soon fell again, down to two on the 31st: total, 841."

"These are the Municipal returns, but they are manifestly incorrect. In Mr. Ash's report for the British Government, that gentleman mentions that on the day Dr. Roque Perez was buried the interments reached 400, and the Municipal returns put down only 231. The Rev. Mr. Ash had so much to do at the cemetery, and among the sick, that his estimate is noteworthy: he calculates 18,700 were buried in the South Cemetery up to April 14th, and 4,000 at the Chacarita up to May 25th, making in all 22,700, while the official returns only give altogether 13,721."

"The Pharmaceutical Society has lost nine members, viz., Drs. Muniz and Roque Perez, and the apothecaries Teodon del Arca, Emilio Furque, Luis Guen, H. Pina, Tomas Pina, Aurelio French, and Felix Ramallo, whose biographies we shall give in our next."

CITY REFORMS.

Gentlemen, I see after all our troubles, that as yet not a single 'bona fide' step has been taken towards city reform. When the cholera ravaged the city, I well recollect how Governor Alsina, upon his own responsibility posted Mr. T. Allen off to Europe to buy water pipes &c. That was the way to do the thing; here we are now almost in the middle of June, we have barely four months to do anything before the summer will be again upon us, and yet it is the same old jog-trot at the Government House and Municipality. Will you so far oblige me as to publish the enclosed? Although I doubt it will do much good, for I note that to gain the public ear, it is necessary to write on such topics as politics, elections, &c. The STANDARD in forming an exception to this rule, has incurred the displeasure of the Government, but I am happy to say has gained the admiration and support of the foreign public of Buenos Ayres."

NAUSEOUS SMELLS.

"Died at her residence, of a nauseous smell, Margaret Smith, in the fortieth year of her age." If, in the mortuary column of this and every other newspaper, the expression 'died of typhoid fever' was struck out, and in its stead was printed 'died of a nauseous smell,' the frequency with which we should find these words occurring would not a little surprise and alarm us."

Is it indeed true, that nauseous smells actually kill? That they are very disagreeable we all know, but that they are deadly every body is not fully aware. We are accustomed to regard our olfactories as a source from which pleasure may be derived, rather than as monitors to warn us of unwholesome and destructive odors. Did we trust them in this latter capacity and heed their monitions, delicate and almost imperceptible as they frequently are, much sickness and many deaths would every year be prevented. It is a fact now very well understood in the medical profession that all excrementitious matters of the human body received again into the body through the lungs, the pores, or the mouth, are direct and deadly poisons. They will kill as certainly as arsenic or prussic acid, or a pellet of cold lead, if enough of them are taken."

Prince Albert died of a minute orifice in the moulting masonry of an old London sewer that ran under a closet adjoining his summer sitting-room. The odor was imperceptible, but it made Queen Victoria a mourner all her days. One among the distin-

guished American dead of 1839 died of a water-closet adjoining his office which was not properly drained. The papers said 'typhoid fever,' and thousands mourned his untimely removal from a field of extensive usefulness here to his everlasting reward."

The country there are fewer deaths from this cause than in the city for reasons quite obvious; populations are not crowded together, and effete matters are returned more promptly to the soil. Yet in the most healthy localities typhoid fever sometimes occurs, and may always be traced to its one only source. In the summer of 1860 the writer of this column spent some months on the plateau of the Cumberland Mountains, than which, perhaps, the world does not afford a more salubrious region. Within a mile of our cottage an entire family lay prostrate with typhoid fever, and two of their number died. What was the matter there? In one large log cabin, imperfectly lighted and ill ventilated, ten persons ate, slept, lived. There was carried on all the work of the family; the beds were never aired, the linen seldom washed, and the slops were thrown where ease and convenience suggested. To a healthy pair of lungs the atmosphere within and around the house was simply intolerable. But they had become accustomed to the odor, though it utterly refused to make peace with them. As the warmth of the sun increases, more and more vigilance should be used by the housekeeper to keep everything in and around her premises perfectly sweet and wholesome. Dry earth will completely disinfect and deodorize every offensive substance. Where this cannot be applied, lime, diluted sulphuric acid, and copperas water form very good substitutes. Particular attention should be paid to the drainage of the sink, especially if that and the well are contiguous. Sleeping rooms should be thoroughly aired and sunned every day, and the bedding hung upon a line or fence at least once every week during hot weather. If these simple rules are, religiously observed, whatever other diseases may affect the family, typhoid fever will not be among them.—American paper.

EDITOR'S TABLE.

The races at Belgrano in aid of the Relief of Yellow-fever Sufferers will come off this afternoon, unless the weather prove very unpromising, and pleasure be obliged to yield to Jupiter Pluvius. The meeting is expected to prove a brilliant one, and very heavy speculation on the different events has been going on for some days: the favorites will carry a great deal of money. As the proceeds are to be devoted to so noble a cause, all those who go pleasure-seeking should make the Belgrano Downs their destination. The steamer Copernicus, of Messrs. Lamport & Holt's splendid fleet, sails to-morrow for Liverpool with mails, passengers, and a full cargo; letters and newspapers can be posted at the Port Captain's office up to 1.30 p.m. We publish a short supplement for this steamer. It is rumored that the attempt to export live cattle to England is about to be renewed on a large scale by an English company. The capital to be employed in the enterprise is stated to be £250,000, and four first-class ocean steamers of 2000 tons burden each will be specially constructed for the service. The question of importing maize from the United States is still attracting great attention in trade circles, and a considerable fall in the price of the article has taken place in our markets. The subject is one of vast importance, and naturally excites vivid interest amongst farmers. An American gentleman of vast agricultural experience here and in the States expressed an opinion to us yesterday that maize can never be exported in a sound state from the Northern Republic to this, unless first 'killed-dried,' and this process is so damaging that the value of the grain for general purposes is seriously reduced. The arrival of the large cargo expected will probably solve the question. The Deum for the cessation of the plague will be sung to-day in the Plaza Victoria, the Archbishop officiating at an altar specially erected for the occasion. Should the weather prove unfavorable, the ceremony will, we believe, be postponed till next Sunday. Dr. Larrosa is about to publish a history of the recent plague, by order of the authorities; the pamphlet will appear in a few days. A special Thanksgiving Service for the termination of the pestilence will be celebrated at the English Church next Sunday at 11 o'clock; the sermon will be preached by the Rev. E. T. Ash, acting chaplain to H.M. Legation. The Nacional of Monday evening contained a leading article of a highly complimentary character respecting the management and progress of the Southern Railway. Our colleague, who is never backward in giving credit where it is due, deserves the thanks of the public, native and foreign, for its well-timed remarks. We find in the latest number of the Diario de Rio Janeiro still further particulars of the departure of the Duoro from that port on the 28th ult. The Count and Countess D'Eu accompanied the august travellers to Fort

Villegaignon, and there took leave of them, returning to Rio on board a steam sloop. The Duoro passed Cape Frio, all well, at four o'clock, at which hour a telegram was sent to the Princess Regent announcing the fact. The daily victims of the plague have dwindled down to two, and the new cases daily reported scarcely exceeded that number. The 'various' diseases are now down to the ordinary rate, out small pox figures unpleasantly high in the list. The Onesta is expected in M'Video to-day; but the belligerents on the other side of the river will probably prevent our having any telegraphic information of the fact. The wires were in working order on Tuesday for a short time, after extraordinary exertions to repair them; but scarcely was the gratifying intelligence flashed through to the office here when the Vaudals cut them again. A great battle is daily expected between the rival forces of Whites and Reds, and neither side wishes to leave the wires intact, lest they might be made use of by the enemy. Rain again fell heavily yesterday morning before daybreak, accompanied by thunder and lightning. The weather seems to have broken for the winter, though the thermometer is unusually high for the time of year. It is stated that the posts left vacant in the Custom-House through the recent epidemic are being filled up by the heads of departments, not by seniority or merit, but by 'selection,' which is generally another word for favoritism; the clerks are about to enter a protest, at least so says a native colleague, which is generally well informed. Any STANDARD reader about to marry on small means (an experiment that generally ends in conspicuous grief), may take a hint from the following paragraph. We can vouch for the merits of 'clam chowder,' the praises of which have been sung by many a writer. Tor a wedding breakfast it is 'hors ligne,' and the North Americans generally hold the theory that a nation that cannot make 'clam chowder' never can be great. Oyster 'clam' is a dish fit for an Emperor, but we fear that even the most fashionable confectioner in Buenos Ayres would find great difficulty in supplying it for a marriage feast:—"A couple in Maine about to be joined in holy matrimony, determined that there should be no nonsense about their bridal. Wherefore they gave notice in the Bangor Whig that they were married on the 6th inst., and that there was to be 'no cards,' and 'no cake,' for the affair was 'nobody's business.' However, by way of compromise, they informed their friends and relatives, that at their residence, on a certain evening, there would be a tree 'clam chowder'—a delightful dish as we can testify, if it be properly made, as it seldom is outside its native New England. That Mr. and Mrs. Twichell and their relatives and friends had a good time, we can easily credit, albeit the bride failed to receive either a \$5,000 shawl, or \$10,000 worth of diamonds." Three hundred and fifty emigrants arrived in the Italo-Platense; many of them went to the camp. Sr. Don Carlos España, Spanish Charge d'Affaires, is about to return home, and will be replaced here by Sr. Ballasteros, at present Secretary to the Spanish Legation at Florence. Sr. de España returns to Europe on his promotion to an important diplomatic post, the well merited reward of the brilliant services he has rendered his country. His numerous friends here while regretting his departure from amongst them, will rejoice at his well deserved elevation. It is said that Dr. Peron will be appointed to the chair of Chemistry in the National College, vice the late Dr. Bernard Weiss. The Victoria and Alegria theatres and the Colcazar Lyrique all announce attractive performances for this evening. The members of the famous Convention met on Wednesday, got through the important business of voting an adjournment till to-morrow, and then went home with the proud consciousness of being about to do justice to their dinner! Loudet, the well-known photographer, is taking the members of the Comision Popular in a group; the work is ordered by a warm admirer of the body, for presentation to the members. Chile is perpetually announcing some discovery or other; the latest are a cure for small-pox and a new motive power for machinery, of course in the opinion of the inventors, destined to supersede steam. Private letters from Chile announce that King Orelie L. of Araucania has been murdered by his Indian subjects; this French adventurer was at one time very popular with the savages he ruled. The Tassaretto will henceforward be called 'The Hospital of San Roque' by order of the Municipality; the place will not smell any the sweeter for the change; 'What's in a name?' Orders have been sent to Europe for ten patent fire-escapes for the 'Bombero Corps.' This is a step in the right direction, for conflagrations have been unpleasantly frequent during the past year, and up to the present the appliances and means to boot' of our Fire Brigade are sadly deficient. The Government of Chile has established a Comision in Cordoba in consequence of the increased business interests of Chileans in that province.

BRAZILIAN TRADE AND FINANCES.

The new Cabinet of Viscount Rio Branco has published an interesting statement of the trade and revenue of Brazil down to the close of 1870, from which we gather that the increasing prosperity of the Empire is observable in every table of statistics whereby we can measure the growth of a nation. We had occasion yesterday to call attention to the wonderful development of trade in the Argentine Republic, almost unprecedented in commercial annals; nor can it be doubted for a moment that most of the leading States of South America are at present experiencing a period of prosperity which almost escapes the notice of the rest of the world, and which is likely not only to be of long duration but to go on, increasing in geometrical ratio; after all, there are no facts clearer than figures, and we recommend their attentive study to our readers and to the legislators and public writers of these countries. From the tables before us we can compare the Brazil of to-day with that of 5 years ago, and see, that in spite of the Paraguayan war, the resources and staple products of the Empire have increased by nearly one-half. The export trade may be put under 3 items, viz—
