THE EXHIBITION.

The second group of objects from the Province of Buenos Ayres is even more interesting than the first, and attracted the attention of all who cared to lounge for a couple of hours, catalogue in hand, through the building. True the objects were of much less value than those at the other quarter of the buildings from Europe; but there was in the show that which afforded an inward satisfaction to those who came up from Buenos Ayres, and doubly so to the resident foreigners of that province who behold on all sides the names of his fellow countrymen ranking side by side with the richest Porteño exhibitors. Buenos Ayres, whether judged by the number of articles it exhibited, or their intrinsic merit in an industrial point, or the varied nationality of the exhibitors, stood first in that national show—and so long as her people betray the same emulation in matters of such high interest to the nation, well does she merit the title of the Excelsior province of the La Plata.

Pará called the Ferro-Carril Paraense. Five special trains ran crowded with guests; and on the same night a State night school for adults was also inaugurated in Pará. Verily, Brazil allows no grass to grow under her feet.

It is really surprising the number of new houses now going up along the Flores Road, which may now be regarded as the great boulevard of Buenos Ayres. On Sunday the tramway runs, and then ho! for Flores.

Such rain at Chivilcoy! The town was fairly drowned out on Monday. The streets were one sea, and the whole camp for leagues and leagues is saturated.

The Transandine expedition was detained a few days at Chivilcoy, owing to bad carts, poor bullocks, and no horses. Mr. Francis Madero had to go out in person to set matters right, and bought up everything required for the expedition, which numbers 45 Europeans and 23 South Americans. Mr. Crawford is now pushing ahead. We all wish him hearty God speed.

The Progresso Club ball, so long looked forward to by the "beau monde," is arranged to come off on next Saturday week, the 4th prox.

The Cordoba papers announce the arrival in that city of Senator Granel, Don A. Benitez, and Dr. Saenz Peña and family on a visit to the Exhibition. Most of the tourists who attended the Inauguration have fled homewards, but a few others are dropping in to have a look at the Fair.

In Mr. Stewart's monster house in New York 1730 persons, of whom 900 are women, are employed. In busy seasons the retail business of the establishment often reaches a value of \$20,000 a day.

The Waterworks Commissioners have issued their report for the six months ending the 30th June last. Although the epidemic interfered greatly, the balance-sheet shows the receipts to have slightly exceeded the expenses.

Professor Amico and his daughters give an attractive concert at the Coliseum this evening. The musical programme is supplemented by experiments in animal magnetism, both on the Misses Amico and any persons amongst the audience who may wish to submit themselves to the Professor. There is nothing more diverting than such experiments on volunteers.

We hear from Cerro Frances B.O. that things are looking up there. Wool 38 lbs. gold on the estancia, and hides in demand.

THE POLICE OF LONDON.

The last report of the Metropolitan Police Board of London is full of facts and suggestions worthy of study on this side of the ocean. The authorised strength of the force consists of 26 superintendents, 257 inspectors, 955 sergeants, and 7,222 constables—an army of 9,160 men. The proportion of policemen to the inhabitants of the vast community in which they are appointed to preserve order is nearly the same as that in New York. Notwithstanding the growth of London in 1870, the number of arrests required to be made in that year was less than in the previous year, being 71,260 in 1870, against 72,951 in 1869. The reason of this favorable showing is, that the magistrates were less injudiciously lenient to offenders in 1870 than in 1869. In the last named year convictions were bad and penalties imposed in only 59.93 per cent. of the cases; but in 1870 the percentage increased to 64.81.

Tables given for the last four years exhibit a steady increase in the percentage of convictions and punishments; in other words, the magistrates are more strict and severe towards offenders, and the result is healthful. Arrested persons guilty of small offences who are discharged through the mistaken kindness of magistrates, too often abuse such clemency, and are again arrested by the police. The statistics prove beyond question that a stern enforcement of the laws against criminals is indispensable to the peace and order of great cities, and that pity and mercy in a magistrate, unless most wisely exercised, are grave public faults. The truth needs to be deeply impressed on the minds of the Police Board and Police justices of New York.

A falling off is noted in every description of crime in London. The Commissioner of the London Police says: "There have been fewer serious crimes during the year than during any previous year since 1866. All these improvements are clearly attributable to the increased efficiency of the police, and to the growing severity of judges—not to omit the admirable operation of the Habitual Criminals act. Under that law, persons known to be thieves and found lounging about in a suspicious manner, may be seized on the charge of "loitering with intent" to steal, and sent up for three months. After discharge from prison all thieves, and others who may be classed as "habitual criminals," are under police supervision, their movements from place to place noted, and a correspondence regarding them is kept up between the police authorities of the severest cities of the United Kingdom. Recently, the plan of taking and exchanging photographs of all habitual criminals has been adopted with good effect. It is believed that by these means and efforts the ratio of crime will be steadily and at last greatly reduced. An Habitual Criminals act is much needed in New York and every State of the Union."

The bond market continues falling. Prices opened at 62½ cash, and closed at 69. During business hours there was a slight reaction in the market, prices fell to 60½ and ran back to 69½, but it was only momentary, bonds kept offering, and prices closed at 69½. It appears that many parties have to recede owing to money seeking other channels of investment; most of those, however, who sell now, sell at a loss. Until the right men enter the market, the bond market must continue as it is. There are parties who are ready and willing to take up the bonds at present afford, but they are waiting until the market touches bottom.

Exchange ruled to-day at 5d on England, and on France 5d 40-5d 2½. Very little done to-day, and brokers complain of dull times.

In the Plaza Once there were about 50 carts of wool in, and 8,000 ar. of wool at the station: all sold before business hours closed. Mr. Duggan sold 10 carts of good wool at 90. Messrs. Kenny Brothers also sold some good lots of wool at 88 and 90.

The traido de Rio is each day increasing; some of its commerce may be gathered from the following facts. On Oct. 1st there were 210 foreign vessels loading and unloading in Rio, of which are 11 German, 7 Norwegian, 2 Argentine, 2 Danish, 9 French, 21 Italian, 14 American, 20 Portuguese, 6 Swedish, 3 Belgian, 2 Russian, and 10 Spanish. Thus it will be seen that England takes the lion's share, and after the Yankees.

The exchange business for the quarter ending 1st Oct. was very large, and amounted to £4,013,000 sterling, £4,846,000 francs on France and Belgium, and £550,000 sterling on Hamburg.

The Custom House of Rio gave the following returns from Jan. 1st '71 to Oct. 1st '71:—\$1,23,863,573. For the same time last year the returns were \$25,466,051,573. Thus the increase this year over last reaches the very splendid figure of 6,657,482, and the following is a table of the banks and joint stock companies at present in operation at Rio.
