The additional duties recently imposed, of 4 per cent ad valorem for he Platense loan, 4 per cent for the Extraordinary loan, and 2 per cent on exports, together make up onefourth of the total revenue for December. In less than 9 years our Import-duties have been doubled, and our Exports which were formerly duty-free have now to pay 8 per cent ad valorem. Thus we see that these new taxes have taken from the public, in one month, \$175,801 in articles for consumption, and \$48,501 in our produce. The Import duties are now beyond all conscience, the Export-lax is ruinous and suicidal. Hew can we blame the French for taxing our wool and hides, if we do

In a word the Customs receipts for Dec. 1871 shew a total of \$1418,465 instead of 193,163 for the same month in 1863. Thus our taxes are increased in 8 years to the tune of 102 per cent. No wonder the Bande Oriental is im poverished.


