We had the pleasure of announcing three weeks ago that the Foreign Club had decided to abolish the regulation which prevents any native of the Argentine Confederation from entering their premises; and, though we have since refrained from alluding to the subject, we have, nevertheless, been on the tip-toe of expectation to hear of the consummation of this desirable

A despotic Government, by granting to foreigners the right to form the Club on condition of their not allowing any native of the country to associate with them, sowed the seeds of dissension between the élite of the native and the foreign community; and it is not, we think, creditable to the latter that this mischievous and barbarous distinction was not swept away immediately the establishment of a free Government made it optional for them to do so, instead of leaving it to breed dissension during twenty years. A practical comment on this drivelling policy is the existence of the comparatively palatial Club which sprang up immediately on the establishment of freedom in the country, whilst the old foreign club, clinging fondly to the swaddling clothes in which it was wrapt by despotism, hangs out in these narrow-minded notions in the
