OVER THE ANDES.
PROJECTS OF COX, NICOUR, CRAWFORD AND WHEELWRIGHT
Local enterprise and foreign gold

are working such wonders in the Argentine Republic that it is no longer a question whether we ought to make a railway from this country to Chile, but rather what is the best pass of the Andes to select for the purpose. Before the ink is yet dry on Mr. Crawford's report of the Planchon, which he says is quite feasible, Mr. Nicour is travelling post-haste from San Juan to this city with the plans of his newly-discovered pass a little below Paso de Los Patos, which he says is 3,000 feet lower than the Planchon.

Meantime it is well to bear in mind that Mr. Cox came from Chile through the Andes in a boat, by what is known as the Nahel-huapi Pass: he left Port Montt, Dec. 16th 1862, with 18 companions, crossed Lake Nahel-huapi and then descended the Rio Negro towards Patagonia, intending to come out on the Atlantic; but his boat capsized in some rapids and after a year's captivity with the Indians he was forced to return to Chile. His mission was achieved, for the latitude of the rapids where he was wrecked shews it was the same place where Villario met a similar disaster in the last century, ascending from Choel-choel on the Atlantic side.

Of course if we can make a railway by Mr. Cox's route it will save all a labor and trouble of ascending mountains ten thousand feet high. There may be still need for much engineering skill in erecting causeways along river-sides, making curves around precipices, providing galleries of rock to protect the line from avalanches and the like, but the one great difficulty of climbing up one of the loftiest ranges in the world is altogether avoided.

From Port Montt, on the Pacific, to Lake Nahel-huapi the distance has already been measured, but we can only make a rough estimate of that from the said Lake to the Atlantic. The route is as follows—

Los Patos is the shortest route from San Juan to Valparaiso (128 leagues), passing through the Zonda valley, by the Patos river and Manantiales. If there were a bridge over the Patos this route would be the best: it was used by Gen. San Martin in leading his army into Chile in 1817.

The sad railway collision of July 25, between the mail express coming from Bordeaux and a shunting goods train, by which four persons were burned alive, and a dozen severely injured is singular.

The highest point on the Copiapó railway is the Molle, near Chañareillo (4,501 feet), which is reached by reverse and compound curves. There is a steep gradient of 1 in 19 between Pabellon and Chañareillo, but an English engineer tells us there are some steeper in England.

But we must hasten from such delightful scenes to the rugged details of Planchon, Los Patos, Fiamballá, and Portesuela, to study the Trans-Andino routes properly so-called. We may premise that there 27 known passes between this country and Chile, viz:

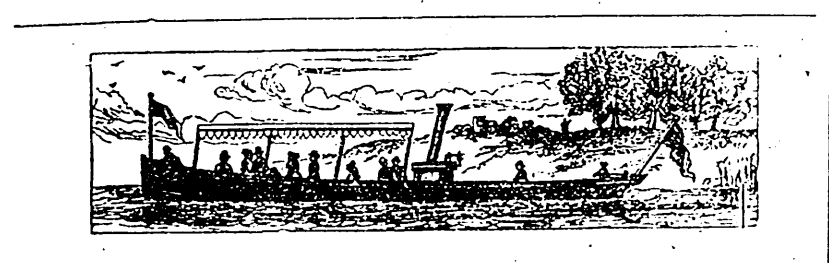
