Here we see that in an area about the size of Ireland nearly one-half con-1869 gave 89.218 inhabitants, of whom foreigners counted over 15 per cent.: these returns compared with 1858 (41,261) shew that the population doubled in ten years.

Not even Buenos Ayres can show such enormous relative increase. An idea of the importance of agricultural 433,680 acres under tillage, cultivated the Banks. by 12,000 able bodied Enropeans, and producing \$25,000 bushels of wheat, without counting maize, vegetables.&c. These colonies are increasing at the rate of 2,000 new settlers yearly, who pay from 5 to 303 per cuadra, say 5 to 30 shillings per acre. Farming lands for pasture are of course much cheaper: £200 per sq. league near the frontier to ten or twenty times that figure in more favored districts. Mr. Larguia mentions lands bought for £100 sq. league, which now fetch from £3,000 to £5,000; and an area of 250 square leagues sold by Government in 1867 at £60, is now worth £800, a league, at which rate the London and River Plate Bank has bought portions, 65 miles distant from the capital.
