FRIDAY, AUGUST 30, 1872. REVIEW FOR EUROPE.

The turning of the first sod of the North Western Railway has been the event of the fortnight, as will be seen by the lengthened account we publish in this issue.

The only political news of importance is the announcement by our correspondent from Rio de Janeiro of the successful result of the Mitre mission, in smoothing down the unpleasant occurrences of which our readers are already so well informed.

The Government and Legislature of Buenos Ayres are busy with a plan of organizing the rural departments on a new footing, and providing a suitable police force of 2000 mounted "vigilantes" and 500 foot constables.

In every other respect the affairs of the country are in a most promising condition, and it would be difficult to find a more prosperous state of things.

Some new colonies are proposed on the Patagonian coast, the success of which we cannot yet predict. Mr. Scarpé has received a concession of 350,000 acres close to the grants already made to M. Roqueland for a fish-oil factory and colony, and to Capt. Piedra Buena, who owns the remote settlement of Santa Cruz River.

During the past fortnight there has been a very active business done in sheepskins also, and the prices for the States both articles have risen to a price hitherto unknown in the River Plate.

As regards wool there is little to note, since the season is over and the market without stock. The last good lot that has been lying in deposit was sold the other day by Messrs. Duggan at \$200 per an, and no contracts for the new clip have as yet been made.

As regards the saladeros there is not the slightest probability of the Government ever allowing them to work again in Buenos Ayres.

The opening of the Italian Bank is a noteworthy event in the history of the fortnight. It has been started by some of the richest Italian merchants of this place, in connection with another bank, and rich capitalists resident in Italy.

The exchange operations for the packet have been large. The bulk of the bills past has been drawn by the Banca di Napoli at 50 pence which is the rate for the best bills in this market.

The emigration returns for the last few months show good figures, and the tide from the Mediterranean to the River Plate is as strong as ever.

NORTH WESTERN RAILWAY. SALTO TO SANTA ROSA. TURNING OF THE FIRST SOD.

The good steamer Villa del Salto, Capt. Morse, with the British and Oriental ensigns flying, and having on board some fifty invited guests for the inauguration of the works of the North Western Railway of Uruguay, arrived at Salto at 1 p.m. on Sunday.

Early on Monday morning the beat of the drum sounded reveille, and town-folk in black clothes elbowed picturesquely attired gauchos who had come in for the occasion.

The North Western Railway of Montevideo, from Salto to Santa Rosa, will be 110 miles in length, and cost £1,100,000, s.g.g., the Government of Uruguay giving a 7 per cent guarantee on £7,000,000 a mile.

The line will traverse a rolling country without serious engineering difficulties, the only steep grade—1 in 50—being close to Salto, and the sharp curve having a radius of a 500-foot metres.

At noon the local battalion was drawn up in front of the hotel, to accompany the procession to the site of the first sod. The day had been clear, but at night of thunder and lightning which had boiled ill for the weather.

Two elegant finished wheelbarrows with gilt spades, bear the arms of the Republic of Uruguay; the other of English elm beautifully polished. The band plays God Save the Queen as we take up our position on the ground.

Minister Herrera Obes takes the first barrow along the bank, being immediately followed in like manner by Mr. Williams and Zumaran. Then His Excellency advancing into the centre addresses the assemblage thus—
