What effect is this extraordinary event likely to produce on the Government and institutions of France? Such is the question which must occur to every one as soon as he can turn his mind from purely financial considerations. The eagerness for the Loan must dissipate many illusions which have prevailed since the war.

In the next place, the industries and saving habits of the French people have been made once more conspicuous. The contemplation of these qualities should put an end to a great deal of the philosophizing on the part of the English which has been desisted since the war.

We have noticed these circumstances because the political relations of Europe may be largely affected by the view foreign nations take of the power, resources, and ultimate destiny of France. Enough has now occurred to show that the country, though, no doubt, it must be heavily weighted by taxation during many years to come, will not be crushed by the necessity of assuaging the Germans.

The claim of France as a nation of confidence is, of course, a far more important question than the claim of a particular ruler, or even a particular Constitution; but, nevertheless, success as it is likely to affect M. Thiers and his Government. In Paris there is much discussion as to whether the success of the Loan is to be looked upon as a success of the Republic; in other words, whether France is trusted in consequence of the Republic in spite of the Constitution.

And also it must not be supposed that because we criticize this scheme, or part of a scheme, we think it worse than those with which Mr. Dominguez is, as we in fact think rightly, dissatisfied. We have given it our attention solely because it emanates from so high an authority as the Minister of Finance.
