THE SCOTT MONUMENT.

High as are the claims of business upon all, and grateful the publication of good market news from Europe by the much-loved for steamers Euro or John Elder, we doubt if we could afford our readers, in this festive epoch, a more grateful subject than that which heads this column. We push from us the new Rosario Railway, Mr. Drabble's report, and many other such matters fit subjects for leaders; they are all good enough in their way, but for once let us step from the beaten path and turn to home associations, to a theme that carries us to the very Mecca of our affections, the Jerusalem of the human heart.

The Scotch residents of New York have presented that city with a statue of Sir Walter Scott, and the full particulars of the unveiling of that statue only reached us yesterday by the Copernicus. We publish them with a double "gout," since not only will the reading of Mr. Cullen Bryant's address open, as Cowper says, "the cells of memory," but furthermore teach us that Scotchmen in the States carry with them to their adopted country the same national spirit which Burns sang and Scott so beautifully depicted.

UNVEILING THE SCOTT MONUMENT.

It seemed eminently fitting that on an early November day, beneath the branches of the trees half stripped of their vestments of green, the statue of Sir Walter Scott should be unveiled in the Central Park. It seemed fitting, too, that it should be placed near the statue of the Bard of Ayr, and upon the high ground, where the cool biting air of Fall, suggesting Highland breezes, swept from the north-west.

The appearance of the 79th (Highlanders) Regiment of the National Guard with kilts, bare knees and plaid, and the sound of the pibroch by the bagpipers, the Scotch thicket spoken by the latter portion of the spectators, and the airs played by Dodworth's band—all reminded us of Edinburgh or Glasgow. The chief places at this festival were surrendered to the Scotch residents of this city and its vicinity, and right earnestly they welcomed their privilege.

A large crowd began to gather in the vicinity of the statue as early as 1 p.m. on Saturday, and an hour later over 5,000 people were on the ground.

A small platform had been erected on the south side of the statue, while the monument was draped with the national colors. At about 3 o'clock the 79th Highlanders, led by the Committee of Arrangements and the special guests, and accompanied by five bagpipers, marched with colors flying and their full musical force from the Casino to the site of the monument. They were received with cheers by the assemblage, and made a fine appearance as they drew up in line and assumed their appointed station. Twenty thousand people were on the Mall by this time, and the scene was an animated one.

In front of the statue the largest number had gathered, filling every seat that had been provided by the Park authorities and standing far in the rear of the benches. The speakers' platform was occupied by the Committee of Arrangements, consisting of Richard Irvin, Chairman; William Wood and William E. Paton, Vice-Chairmen; Robert Gordon, James Moir, John S. Kennedy, Bryce Gray, John Paton, Walter Watson, James Fraser, Robert Mackie, Robert Dinwiddie, Alexander Knox, A. M. Stewart, Joseph Laing, and the Secretary, James Brand.

Controlling Andrew H. Green and William Cullen Bryant were also on the platform. All wore sprigs of heather in their button-holes. Behind the platform, a mass of people eager to see and hear was kept back with difficulty by the police. To the east of the statue were ranged the musicians, under the direction of H. B. Dodworth, and behind it the 79th Regiment of Highlanders, who stood in an open space marked off for them by ropes. On the north-west side of the statue invited guests occupied seats, while many spectators, unable to obtain positions elsewhere, stood behind them.

The ceremonies were opened by Richard Irvin, Chairman of the Scott Monument Committee, who formally presented the statue to the Commissioners. William Wood stepped forward and made a few remarks, ending by quoting Shakespeare's lines: "As he lived peopled, So his dead likeness, I do well believe, Shall whatever yet you looked upon, Or heard of, be as lively as the life."

As he uttered the word "behold" the covering was suddenly withdrawn from the statue, and Sir Walter Scott's sculptured face appeared. A second of breathless silence followed the first glimpse of the great Scotch poet, and then there burst forth from the audience applause which was prolonged for fully five minutes. The pipers, with their bagpipes playing "Bonny Dundee," then marched in three files around the statue. On the north side of the statue, and in the course of a short address said: "In the disposition of works of this monumental character, always difficult in public grounds, it is the intention of the Park Commissioners so to arrange the monuments, that they shall be a benefit to the community, and not a detriment to the public health."

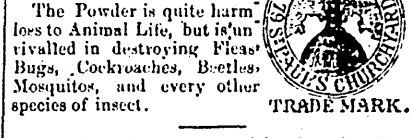
