OUR AGRICULTURAL COLONISTS.

New California was founded in 1866 by some Californian families who bought 14 leagues of land from the Santa Fe Government at £50 per league.

Arrived in November, 1870, and more have been engaged. The situation, soil, &c., are excellent.

Caracaras, on the river of the same name, 9 leagues from Rosario, is another of the Central Argentine colonies, offering the same conditions and advantages as Bernstadt.

The Welsh colony, a league beyond the Californian, consists of laborious settlers who left the Chubut colony in Patagonia, in 1869, and obtained a grant of a square league from the Santa Fe Government.

Blais is also on the San Javier, two leagues further North than the Welsh. It comprises a grant of twenty leagues to Mr. Vernon, who arrived with his families in August, 1869, and they raised tobacco with much success.

Alcandora, between the rivers San Javier and Saladillo Amargo, is north of Fort San Javier, in the Gran Chaco, forming part of an area of 22 leagues which Messrs Thomson, Burt, and another Company of London obtained from the Santa Fe Government.

The Lusitania's mails have brought us the full particulars of the terrible Peruvian conspiracy, the first news of which came to us by telegram.

The day before yesterday the report of a shot was heard to proceed from the upper story of the corner of the theatre in Lima, occupied by Don Guillermo Bogardus and family.

The Governor of the respective district immediately repaired to the house, where he found Don José S. Heredia, in company with some ladies and two other individuals.

The place of meeting was the house of a woman named Dolores Valiente, situated near to the railway.

The torpedos were to have been fired on the night of the 18th, on the return of the President to Chorillos; but he remained in Lima, and the men who had met together at the former place were ordered to disperse by means of signal rockets.

Among other schemes that he had heard of was one for making a revolution, in which the President was to be assassinated, and his body burnt afterwards in the square; that he knew, through Beausigori and one Villamar, that a million of soles was lying in the hands of a respectable house ready to be distributed as soon as the first blow was struck; that the President was to be blown up on the 24th December, but in consequence of his (Heredia) and Valiente having opposed that idea, a dispute occurred between Bogardus and Valiente, in which the former accused him of being the cause of the frustration of the plan, because he was a government spy.

The news from the sister city is still encouraging. The few cases are quite forgotten and the weather is fine. Although the accounts from Rio are bad (one source declares the deaths from yellow fever to have reached 51 one day, and that typhus fever is also raging) the chances are 10 to 1 that Buenos Ayres and Montevideo escape this year.

We give in another column a full description of the attempt to blow up President Pardo, taken from the Lima papers. We hear by letter that Consul Hutchinson headed a deputation of foreigners to congratulate the President on his escape from a premature visit to the shores of the Stix.

Public opinion has so turned against President Pardo, says our correspondent, that he is now rooted in the streets, where he is surrounded by a veritable 'white-headed' boy with the Limenes. Such is life up to-day, down to-morrow, and upside down the day after.

Later accounts of the lamentable results of the fire in the Fifth Avenue Hotel, New York, Feb. 22, are that 21 servants were burned to death in the upper story of the house, although the firemen displayed the greatest heroism in trying to save them.

There is a prodigious hub-bub amongst the shopkeepers in London just now in consequence of the female 'upper crust' going in for 'the cheap,' and patronising the Civil Service Stores, shops where goods are sold at wholesale prices, and where the poor, overworked, underpaid, genteel employees in Somerset House and other Government offices 'My Lady' and all her 'Honourable Misses' would deal at these stores, to the intense disgust of the fat burghers who used to have her on their books.

The shopkeepers are grumbling. Last night they assembled in large numbers at the residence of Mr. W. P. Adams, the president of the Society of Shopkeepers, member for Marylebone and Common Sergeant of the city of London, made an angry protest against the conduct of 'nobility,' who, while owing large accounts to their tradesmen, did not think it beneath their dignity to visit the Civil Service Stores, 'make purchases there for ready money, and absolutely carry provisions and groceries home in their private carriages.

This is true: Anyone who walks up the Haymarket can satisfy himself that it is so, and he will derive amusement too from witnessing the disgust with which the Jeaneases and John Thomases carry out parcels from 'The Store' and deposit them in the stricken vehicles driven up outside. Before long we shall hear of a riot among the funkeys on this very head, and a determination on the part of the brethren of the plush to enter no family which deems itself worthy of patronage of the co-operative system.

Two new tanneries, we hear, are about to be started at Almagro. Pleasant news this for that unfortunate family, which is already harassed and oppressed by the abominable and sickening stench from the tannery, 'grasaria,' or whatever it is already there, which has been knocked on the ground, instead of encouraging new ones.
