On the liquidation the bulls came forward and asked for more bonds; 46,000 were then and there sold for to-morrow at 80, and 40,000 for the end of March at 81 1/2. The bulls pushed the market for more, but at these rates there were no sellers.

There was a brisk movement in cedulas. Two well-known holders sold out, it was said, with a view to use their money in discounts, but many thought it was more to break the market. This stock is singularly plentiful on 'Change, and as it is very bulky it shows. One sees brokers at every point with rolls of cedulas under their arms.

The other day one broker bought all that were offered, and such was the pile that it required almost a whole library to remove the stock. Discount in the open market to-day ruled firm at 9, consequently cedulas are dropped willingly as they only give 8, and most of the holders can still realize at profit. The sales were—

The freshness of this proposal led merit to the 'pacheco.' This payment of ten millions was paid by the National Bank on its opening has 'punged' all the brokers into the most obscure calculations as to the dangers and inopportunities to the market that are feared; these gentlemen are perhaps unaware that only last month a well known New York broker, Mr. J. Gould, had to pay an equal sum in an hour.

The following advices we have received per Senegal:—

'Bradford, Thursday—The new year opens hopefully, with an active inquiry and strong prices. During the past week there have been some good transactions in wool. Our market is not largely supplied, the principal stocks being held in the country where holders are extremely firm, accordingly prices in this market are going against buyers, and an advance of five shillings a pack has been established upon the rates of last week. Good deep lustrous sorts, Irish and North wools, are especially saleable and specially firm. Skin wools, though good to sell, are not dearer. Noils and rokes are both scarce and dear. In worsted yarns for export the inquiry has become so adjusted, and there is some speculative feeling. Spinners, both of single and twofold yarns, are asking advanced rates, and buyers, though not prepared for so much, are willing to meet them half way. Lustrous yarns have also improved. Dem. wett yarns, though firm, are in less request than last week. In price no new feature presents itself, but business is steady and prices firm.

'Yesterday Messrs Laird Brothers launched from their works of Birkhead a very handsome screw steamer, the Colombia, which is to form an addition to the extensive fleet of the Pacific Steam Navigation Company, and is intended to be principally employed in their service on the West Coast of America, to meet the special requirements of which trade she is fitted with an extensive arrangement of deck-houses in similar style to the other vessels of the same class already built for the company. The Colombia is a sister vessel to the Santa Rosa launched from the same works in Oct. last. The vessel left the stocks in fine style, the ceremony of christening being performed by Miss Fletcher, daughter of James Fletcher, Esq.; and among those present we noticed Mr. Graves, M. P., and Mr. Just, director of the company.

We extract the following from the report just sent to the U. S. Congress by Mr. Post Master Creswell. It shows the great expense the U. S. Government goes to, to keep up a regular steamship mail service:—

'The cost of the United States transatlantic mail steamship service for the year 1872 was \$2,200,770, being an increase of \$46,161 32 over the cost of the same service for the year 1871. The payments made to the respective steamship lines conveying mails to Europe, receiving the sea-postages as full compensation for the service, was as follows, viz:—

The following advices we have received per Senegal:—

'Bradford, Thursday—The new year opens hopefully, with an active inquiry and strong prices. During the past week there have been some good transactions in wool. Our market is not largely supplied, the principal stocks being held in the country where holders are extremely firm, accordingly prices in this market are going against buyers, and an advance of five shillings a pack has been established upon the rates of last week. Good deep lustrous sorts, Irish and North wools, are especially saleable and specially firm. Skin wools, though good to sell, are not dearer. Noils and rokes are both scarce and dear. In worsted yarns for export the inquiry has become so adjusted, and there is some speculative feeling. Spinners, both of single and twofold yarns, are asking advanced rates, and buyers, though not prepared for so much, are willing to meet them half way. Lustrous yarns have also improved. Dem. wett yarns, though firm, are in less request than last week. In price no new feature presents itself, but business is steady and prices firm.

'Yesterday Messrs Laird Brothers launched from their works of Birkhead a very handsome screw steamer, the Colombia, which is to form an addition to the extensive fleet of the Pacific Steam Navigation Company, and is intended to be principally employed in their service on the West Coast of America, to meet the special requirements of which trade she is fitted with an extensive arrangement of deck-houses in similar style to the other vessels of the same class already built for the company. The Colombia is a sister vessel to the Santa Rosa launched from the same works in Oct. last. The vessel left the stocks in fine style, the ceremony of christening being performed by Miss Fletcher, daughter of James Fletcher, Esq.; and among those present we noticed Mr. Graves, M. P., and Mr. Just, director of the company.

We extract the following from the report just sent to the U. S. Congress by Mr. Post Master Creswell. It shows the great expense the U. S. Government goes to, to keep up a regular steamship mail service:—

numerous two-storey houses in process of construction, the Railway and also works going ahead and business brisk. The Rio Cuarto Hall-way is continuing to be finished in a couple of months, carriage for the mails and passengers are at present run twice a week from Villa Maria to a point within 12 miles of Rio Cuarto, which is a great convenience to the travelling public. The moorquits this year in Rosario are worse than ever before known, and met with as far up inland as Villa Maria.

The National Government has just named Mr. Richard Luján Inspector of the rolling stock of the Rio Cuarto Railway. Mr. William H. Taylor, Inspector of permanent way, and Mr. William Gorman, station-master at Rio Cuarto.

Owing to rumours of bandits prowling about the passes of the Andes, General Arredondo has sent a small force to one of the passes to protect the troops passing to and fro.

The Provincial Government has just created a special office for the collection of gas and saladero tax. This is a new move; far better to have abolished the tax in toto. Mr. Abraham Walker is named chief of the new department, and Mr. Bla Despony, second in command.

The Chilean steamer Sorota was looked for to-day, and some parties think that she will bring the American mails, lying in Rio Janeiro since the 19th ult. This American mail service really calls for some reform.

General Julius White, of Illinois, has been named by President Grant Minister Resident to the Argentine Republic, and Congress has ratified the nomination. The new Minister may be looked for in a few months. We hope he will do something towards reforming the present American and River Plate mail service.

Advice from Parana are not favorable. It appears that the Islands in front of Victoria are crowded with runaways, who openly state that they will not return until the invasion takes place. At Gualeguay there has been a gathering of sufficiently suspicious characters, and upon the whole, people up there write down much dissatisfied with the present Government. Entre Rios is a hard place to govern.

Some fine wool was sold to-day in the Plaza Once at 95. This is a high figure, and it requires to be indeed very fine wool and in excellent condition to obtain it. The average price for first class merino is from 80 to 87. Nearly all the cards have left the Plaza Once, and the place looks almost as 'much deserted as in the end of winter. The receipts for freight on the West-coast Railway also show a diminution, and perhaps never before so low as recorded at this time of the wool market in such a state. The bulk of the wool is still outside.
