The National Congress.

The Executive has the honor to present to Congress the following project of law offering reprisals, with a view to putting a stop to the atrocious murders perpetrated by Lopez Jordan not only upon soldiers of the National army, but also upon public employees surprised in their offices, whose throats are cut there and then; and a reward will now be offered to any party or parties who will deliver up Richard Lopez Jordan, Mariano Querencia, and the other perpetrators of these horrible barbarities, which present the country to the eyes of the world as a land of Carnivals.

The President, as Commander-in-Chief of the National Army, must obey the uses of war as laid down by the law of nations, so long as that war is conducted as war between nations; but a rebellion is no war, and the Government is only required to have recourse to arms to suppress it for the purpose of having the rebels tried by the tribunals.

Lopez Jordan proposes to renew the barbarous traditions of the times of Artigas and Rosas, of confiscation and throat-cutting, with the view to intimidate. In order, therefore, that these criminals do not escape, and to stimulate parties to help justice in their arrest, the Government is about to offer large sums for their capture.

President Johnson, when similarly situated, offered two hundred thousand patacons reward for the apprehension of Booth, the murderer of President Lincoln; and the first officers of the army, besides various honorable citizens, set about to catch him.

The United States Congress fearing that the ex-President Jefferson, after the defeat of the Confederate army might prolong the struggle by going about the country calling himself president, and acting as such, offered a reward of two hundred thousand dollars for his capture, and paid same; as also they did to the captors of Booth.

This system of reward is adopted by every nation, and the present national government also adopted it in Santa Fe with the greatest success, having offered a reward of a thousand patacons for the murderer of an Englishman.

Lopez Jordan is not only the cause of the throat cutting of all the public employees, national and provincial, but he also murders citizens like Casus and Amasillo, for having remained faithful to the constitution and the laws in the last insurrection; he is the murderer of the governor of Entre Rios, Captain General Don Justo Jose de Urquiza, according to the proofs given and his own confession; and this system of assassination he further carried out in murdering Urquiza's two sons, Colonel Taboada and others, which shows that he uses it to intimidate the people, and that his banner is to cut the throat of all who refuse to join his cause.

The National Executive, before resorting to reprisals which the law of nations allows against an enemy—although Lopez Jordan cannot be raised to the dignity of an enemy,—has deemed it proper to enumerate to Congress the various barbarities which have led to the proposed law, with the view that same be passed, and thus by a public act condemn this savage system which the enemies of the nation hold up to the world as traits of our people and national characteristics.

These three soldiers and the sergeant whose throats were cut whilst at their posts had five decorations, and ought to be protected against the treachery of Vandals which no courage can resist.

The Government hopes, therefore, Congress will grant to their families as pension, their full pay.

PROJECT OF LAW.

Art. 1. One hundred thousand patacons reward will be given to the party or parties who will deliver up to the National authorities (except if taken as prisoner of war by the army) Richard Lopez Jordan, murderer of the Governor of Entre Rios.

Art. 2. Ten thousand patacons will be given to the party or parties who will deliver up Mariano Querencia, Custom-house swindler of Concordia and the murderer of Waldino and Justo Urquiza, and of one sergeant and three soldiers of the 9th of the Line.

Art. 3. One thousand patacons will be given for the capture of the villains who assisted in these murders, and no plea of obedience to superior orders as an excuse for these crimes will be of avail.

Art. 4. These charges will be passed to the account of the Lopez Jordan rebellion.

Art. 5. These measures if unexecuted will in no way restrict the military command vested by the Constitution in the Commander and Chief of the forces.

Art. 6. The families of all officers, sergeants, corporals and soldiers who may be murdered by the rebels during the present war shall enjoy their full pay as pension.
