





A home paper says that the scarcity of coal in England is likely to result in the stoppage of some of the Atlantic steamers.

A Western newspaper gives a thrilling account of a steamer's perilous voyage, describing particularly her dangerous passage over the Falls, with only "one inch of water between her keel and the rocks, and half an inch of atmosphere between her chimneys and the bridge."

The anxiety as to the fate of Captain Piedra-Buena has been allayed by a letter from Mr. Greenwood per last Pacific steamer from Sandy Point.

Letters from the South of the province report a frightful earthquake shock down there on the 25th of May.

How it was done.—Truth and fiction are so nearly allied that it is hard to discern between them.

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"I don't know in which way Mr. S. is connected with the English bark Geraldine and I only pity the poor owners of her, who have fallen in with Mr. S. as I had before.

"It is false also that I refused to pay Captain Nesbitt the costs of maintaining the crew of the wrecked schooner B. Ayres on the voyage to Montevideo.

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As to the facts and Mr. Stephens' purpose in publishing his article, I wish to state them briefly.

The German Schooner London remained in Sea Bear Bay all right, when the Geraldine left on the 12th of April.

The London had according to her captain's report to me for 6 or 7 weeks provisions. Captain Kettwich of the lost schooner Buenos Ayres assured me the same, adding even that they have bread sufficient for 5 or 6 months as well as plenty of fresh water, guns and powder.

In consequence the report of Mr. Stephens about the provisions is false, but even it would not matter, should Captain Assmy run short of provisions, he knew pretty well that in Carmen or Bahia Blanca he would find what he might want, as there can be no question about this point.

Since the arrival of the Geraldine, which brought me the last letters from the London, no ship whatever has come from the coast.

It is certain the schooner ought to be here a week or two ago, and I expect her anxiously; but every one knows very well that the delay of some weeks in the loading of a ship on that coast, or on the voyage from there, can easily occur, principally if, as I suppose, the London has gone for provisions to Carmen or Bahia Blanca.
