It is only in the month of April that we see any increase of deaths, and if we take the four months collectively it would be easy to show that epidemics diminish the rate of mortality. Vail-lant supposes the cases were 1,000 this season, and the estimate is hardly wrong, but the general impression in M. Video is, that half the cases proved fatal. Probably the real number of deaths lies, between 400 and 500, and it would certainly have been much higher if the citizens had not taken a timely panic.

HORSE BREEDING.

A project is discussed by some Englishmen of old standing in the Banda Oriental to get up a joint-stock company for the rearing and exporting of horses to meet the requirements of the English, French, Indian, and other foreign markets. With a capital say of £100,000, or even less, the industry might be started under circum stances calculated to be attended with every success. The programme briefly is as follows:-

1st. To purchase on the Uruguay an estancia of five or six square leagues. tence it in, and make it the seat of ope rations, taking care that the depth of water will allow horses to be shipped 2nd. To import blood horses from

England for the improvement of the breed: the mares can be purchased here for a dollar a head.

3rd. To export yearly so many hunired young horses, to England, Bombay or elsewhere. 4th. To obtain some security from the Montevidean Government that the establishment in question should be

respected in time of civil war. As regards the first three clauses there seems not the least difficulty, but how can the promoters obtain the guarantee from the Government of Uruguay? If even such were granted we have no confidence of the guarantee subsequently proving effective, and although it is possible the Banda Oriental may now enjoy peace for a period. the history of the country would not warrant capitalists sinking their money in this manner on a delicate con-

tingency. It seems to us more natural to pro pose establishing the farm in question say at Enconada or Zarate, where no Government guarantee is needed, but only half-a-dozon well armed farmservants. The land and cost of fenoing will entail more outlay than in Banda Oriental, but the result seems more certain, and the facilities for shipping are notorious.




