REVIEW FOR EUROPE.

The Entre Riano revolution has begun to languish, and yesterday brought news of another success by the Government troops near Parana. The great difficulty is to get the rebels to fight. Splendidly mounted, at the cost of the estancieros, they rove from one part of the province to the other.

At last the Provincial Legislature has taken action in the monetary crisis from which we have been suffering. The measure passed by the Chambers was required not so much as a positive relief as for its moral effect.

President Sarmiento's proposed immigration law is decidedly the most liberal and comprehensive ever dictated in this matter at any time or in any country.

Several new and important railway extensions are on the tapis, viz.: two of Bragado, Nueve de Julio and Saladillo on the Western line, and Cañuelas and Dolores on the Great Southern.

The sale of the Western Railway is again mooted. This is the oldest line in the country, and was built entirely by Government, partly with funds from the Bank which are now urgently required.

In 1870 imports stood to exports as 9 to 5; in 1872 they were as 4 to 3. The tonnage of the Argentine ports has almost doubled in the last two years.

The coming election for a successor to President Sarmiento occupies attention here and in the Provinces, and will probably keep party politics rather animated until the election, next year.

In our commercial columns will be found a full account of the state of our markets; during the past fortnight there has been intense stringency in money; all the banks stopped discounting, and the Provincial Bank has raised its rate of discount to 9 per cent.

GENERAL COLONIZATION LAW. FREE PASSAGES FROM EUROPE.

The Colonization bill presented to Congress by President Sarmiento is the most complete that has ever emanated from any Government in the continent of America.

The national territories of the Chaco, Misiones, Pampas and Patagonia to be measured, out in sections of five leagues square, or 166,650 acres each.

2. Maps in chess-board fashion showing 625 farm lots of 266 acres each; the black squares to be kept for Government, the white to be given to the colonists.

3. A premium of 500 dollars each on the first 100,000 immigrants settling down in the above territories, payable eighteen months after arrival.

4. The Government may contract with any company offering at least 160 families towards colonizing a section.

5. No contract will be admitted by Government unless the company stipulate to give the settlers a house, farm implements, seeds, and food for twelve months.

20. As far as possible each colony shall be composed of various nationalities, with 5 per cent natives.

21. Parties holding national lands at present must have their titles revised within 3 months.

22. Freedom of worship and instruction, civil marriage, in all the colonies.

THE MONETARY CRISIS. GOVERNOR ACOSTA'S MESSAGE.

So much unprofitable discussion has occupied public attention respecting the present crisis that it is gratifying to see the Provincial Government, under date 18th inst., urge the Legislature of B. Ayres to solve the difficulty at once, in a suitable manner.

The Chamber of Deputies, Public authorities can never be expected either to prevent a crisis or to remedy it; but they have clearly the duty to take any lawful measures towards helping the commercial public in the midst of perturbations.

Your House sent the bill to Committee, where it lay a month, while the said Committee was hatching another project for Bank reform and the prevention of future crises; forgetting that the urgency of the occasion called for a prompt relief to the commercial interests of the city.

Such a proceeding, however advisable in a question of Bank reform, causes untimely delay in the urgency of the present case, and obliges the Government to present its original project with the modifications deemed necessary.

1st. To authorize the Bank Directors to take 3 million \$ fts. from the Oficina de Cambios.

2nd. To order the Provincial Bonds to be disposed of abroad, and with the proceeds supply the place of the 3 millions \$ fts.

COMMERCE OF THE PLATE. BOARD OF TRADE RETURNS. ARGENTINE FINANCE REPORT.

The Times of May 29th contains the Board of Trade returns for exports from Great Britain during the quarter ending March 31st, as compared with those of the same quarter in 1872.

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ROADS AND RAILWAYS. More than public schools, or joint-stock companies, or any other element of moral or material progress, is a facility of communication identified with the development of a nation's industry.

1. Villa Maria to Rio Cuarto, 85 miles: this line was commenced in Nov. 1870, and about 400 men kept constantly at work, till it was ready for traffic, the whole length, by the end of the current year.

2. Rio Cuarto to Mercedes, 77 miles: this is the line for which tenders were opened last March at the Government house, to be constructed on the same wide gauge (5ft 6in) as the Rio Cuarto line.

3. Corboba to Tucuman, 340 miles: the contract was signed with Messrs. Fellner & Co., on September 19th, 1872, for the construction of this line within 4 years, narrow gauge of 3ft 6in, at 14,708 9/16 cts per kilometre.

4. Buenos Ayres to Campana, 47 miles: the works were begun by Mr. Alati on October 11th, 1872, but have not been much advanced, owing to delay in the arrival of materials from England.

7. The Cuyo Railways, 1000 miles: these are the proposed narrow-gauge lines for which proposals will be opened at the Government house on the 9th of July, viz—

I. Buenos Ayres, Rosario, S. Luis and Mendoza.

4. Seber's Wharf, near the gas-house. The concession was signed in August, 1872, the wharf to be completed in 18 months. Mr. Seber's concession is for 10 years, but he must remove the wharf in 3 months if at any time he is considered in the way.

5. Punta Lara. Mr. Wheelwright's pier, in connection with the "Pasadena" Railway, was commenced in October, 1872, about a mile this side of Ensenada, with a small branch line. It will be of Baltic pine, 3,000 feet long, in 198 spans of 15 feet each; the width next shore will be 20 feet, stretching out to 40 feet at the extremity, where vessels drawing 13 1/2 feet, at low water, can load or discharge. The works are so far advanced that they will probably be complete before the end of the year.

Last night in the "Central Press," a little leaf which goes into the provinces, the editors of the "Telegraph" sent their explanation that the articles in "All the Year Round" and its own Khiva letter, were written by the same hand, an Oxford graduate, accomplished gentleman, Russian scholar, &c.

This morning the "Telegraph" publishes a furious article against the independent and libellous "Globe," and in the face of the Times' accusation, a just accusation, that its over eagerness to adopt the column, was to be expected of the editors of that paper, who are so jealous of the "Telegraph" and its rivalry of the "Telegraph" that they carefully omitted in their parliamentary reports a flattering allusion made by Mr. Walpole to the "Daily Telegraph."

The "Globe" replies to-night that the "Telegraph" gives us fine sentiments, but that so far the fact remains that the public has been imposed upon either by the article in "All the Year Round" or by the letter in the "Telegraph."

Since the change in the French Government there has been a general lull in politics. The new President has not yet shown his policy. We have got to discover if he be the same man as he is taken for, and if he intends to be ruled by the Duc de Broglie and his friends, or intends to dismiss them and put in power his own.

Meanwhile the Bourgeois goes up in ecstasies at the idea of Marshal MacMahon being declared by the Assembly President for five years, and all the Radical papers being suppressed. A most delicate and important thing is money, as Mr. Gladstone told us in his late speech at the Literary Fund dinner, at which he presided.

EDITOR'S TABLE.

One of the most wonderful events in editorial life occurred in this city yesterday. A new city club sent down to the "Pampa office" to subscribe for 300 copies daily. Mr. Paz, the editor, with polished politeness, declined to accept the order, stating that the club could only subscribe for one copy in the office, any further copies that it might require the club could purchase from the boys in the streets, who usually disposed of 2,000 copies daily.

The foreign reading public is at the moment under a very heavy fire from the news agents; let no man henceforward say that he is not a paper; the days are simply impossible. With Dear Davis and Jacobsen and Soderstedt on both flanks, a man may be short of money, but we defy him to be short of his European papers. Hear ye, hear ye!

One result of the Crisis is that, next week, the Mortgage Bank will close on a creditor and sell a couple of his houses to square the account. The biggest thing in the Mortgage way lately done is 300 Paraguanys pledged land valued at 35 millions sterling in part security, for the last loan she raised in London. Such is the official value put on the lands, but it came to a foreclosing business and an order to Bullrich we tremble for the result.

Two of the celebrities of the European turf, Count X. and Mr. W. M., have made a curious wager. Each is to ride to Vienna, take a ticket for the exhibition, and at once ride back to Paris. Four of their best horses will be allowed to each; but the ride home from Vienna is to be done on a single horse each. The wager is £1,000 a side, and the betting on the event in Paris and Vienna is something unheard of.

Next Friday will be the glorious Fourth of July, the great festival of the Sons of true Liberty and Equality, without too much talk about it. General White, U. S. Minister, has left Florida and taken up his residence in New York. The United States Legation is at Mr. Folmar's, in Calle Reconquista.

Advices from Montevideo state that all questions between Italy and that republic have been arranged by Dr. Perez Gomez, who has just returned from Europe. A total amount to be paid by the Banda Oriental for Italian claims is one million two hundred thousand pesos, for which sum the Oriental Government will issue bonds, with five per cent interest.

The Oriental war steamer Vigilante has been sold in this port for the sum of \$50,000. The second section of the Bolgrano tramway is now open to the public; the line is doing a splendid traffic, and the cars run so smoothly that the passenger asks who is the constructor; we believe there is no better made tramway in Buenos Ayres, and to Mr. Dawson, the contractor, is due every praise.
