

3rd. That as many mercantile houses now sell English and French postage stamps the Public will still be able to pre-pay their letters home independent of the Consuls.

4th. That the Post-Office is a branch of our internal revenue. The Minister of Foreign Affairs having published a note on this matter, datal Somewher 4th. 1872 and the Pastranster Gall. ed Sep ember 4th, 1872, and the Postmaster-General and Attorney-General having given their views on the case,

views on the case,

It is hencey decreed—

1st. That the permission given by the Government of Buenos Ayres is hereby annulled.

2nd. All letters entering or leaving the Republic must pass only through the Post-Office.

3rd. Letters may be sent with or without the stamp, until a postal convention be agreed on.
