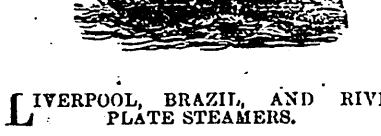

With a better Dredge and more lighters we could do much more. As I advised Your Excellency on May 19th we can do 95 per cent of our dredging at the rate of 4,500 tons daily, and a cost of one paper-dollar per ton.

The experimental channel will be 1½ mile, of which, of which about one-sixth is now done: we have removed about one-fifth of the whole stuff, including 1500 cubic yards removed by the current.

The expenses have been much heavier than they would have been if Mr. Bateman had been requested to send out the Dredges and machinery.

The cost since June 1st was under 1 hard dollar per cubic yard, and the rest of the work will hardly exceed 75 cents per cubic yard, including only salaries, coal and other expenses on board.

From the beginning we have had a number of accidents, every one of which might have been prevented, but I was allowed no interference in the matter.

The Government published yesterday the note of Minister Dominguez to Congress, dated July 4th, accompanied by Mr. Moore's report and that of the special committee of inspection.

Your Hon. Chambers having asked me for a report on Moore's experimental channel, I beg to hand you his statement and make three observations as follows:

1st. The law for the said channel was promulgated on November 5th, 1872; we appointed a committee of supervision on the 15th, and obtained from the Provincial Government a dredging-machine, which we handed over to Mr. Moore on January 20th.

2nd. The result has been most favorable, the channel being 60 ft. wide, and although only dredged to 11 ft., it is now 12 ft. deep, owing to the current. The work also becomes easier as the men get accustomed: in April and May they excavated 5050 cubic yards in 13 days, and in June 5100 cubic yards in 8 days.

3rd. The total cost, including the repairs beforehand, is \$50,000 up to date, and with \$30,000 more the work will be completed. This is not lost money, as it will form part of Bateman's works. The channel will require to be longer than calculated, but with half the amount of dredging, showing that Bateman's estimates were too high.

Mr. Moore's Report. On November 4th 1872 I was notified to undertake the experimental channel ordered by Congress.

The Dredge went aground at the Boca on Dec. 13th and only reached the roadstead by the 31st. It was handed over to me on January 20th, in so bad a condition that 3 months were spent in repairs, till, on April 22nd, I was able to begin the dredging.

All expenses up to that time were for repairs, and should not be included in the cost of the channel: the only thing that I would do in the interim was to lay down stakes and buoys along the proposed channel.

From April 22nd up to to-day (June 27th) the Dredge worked 204 hours, say 20½ working days:

Length of channel 440 yards, Depth of do 44 feet, Material removed 10,000 tons, Lighters filled 223.

We lost 33½ days from bad weather, repairs, or want of water on the bank, where the experiment was ordered against my will.

My intention was to make the experimental channel 240 feet wide and 12 feet deep at low water; but the Government engineers have obliged me to make it 50 feet wide and 5 feet excavated.

Philadelphia, May 30th. A fire of great severity broke out in Boston this morning about 8 o'clock, which caused much fright among the people, who have scarcely recovered from the impression remaining from the terrible conflagration of last November.

To-day's fire is located south of the old burnt district, and began in the extensive furniture warehouse of Harley, Morse & Co., No. 41, Washington-street, near Boylston and Essex streets.

Strong northerly winds were blowing, which quickly extended the fire southward along Washington-st., and it also passed through the block to Harrison-avenue, the next street east of Washington-street, and also to Beech-street, which is south of Essex-street.

At one time over forty buildings in the blocks fronting on these streets and on Tyler and Hudson streets adjoining were in flames, while the fire also extended some distance westward from Washington-street towards Tremont-street, which bounds the Common.

Among the buildings burned were the Globe Theatre, the International Hotel, and Chickering's Building, the

Boylston Bank and the Freeman's Bank. The Presbyterian church at Harrison-avenue and Beech-street was partially burned, as also was the Boylston Market, the fire being extinguished in the latter; however, before any great amount of damage was done.

There being intense excitement, and vast crowds filling up the streets, impeding the operations of the firemen, the authorities called out the military to aid the police in keeping order, and the patrols forcing the crowds back, the firemen were given more room to work.

By 1 o'clock the spread of the flames in all directions had been checked, the fire not having reached Tremont-street on the west, but having worked its way against the wind northward almost to Chaucey-street, which is one of the boundaries of the old burnt district.

Portions of five blocks were burned over, but a considerable surface was covered with small and not very valuable buildings. The loss is estimated at about \$3,500,000.

To-night all danger from the fire is past, and the firemen are playing upon the smouldering embers. The loss is to a great extent covered by insurance in Boston, New York, Philadelphia, Hartford, and English companies.

At one time to-day there was a great stir among the insurance offices, who feared a very heavy loss, but the danger happily passed.

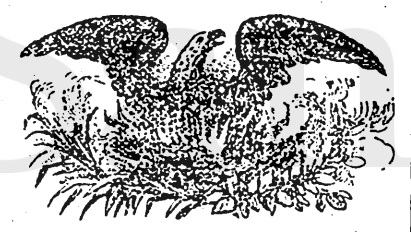
