B. Ayres, June 23rd, 1873. To the Commission on Water Supply, Drainage, Sewerage and Paving of the City.

Gentlemen, In fulfilling the request made by the Commission, that I should draw up some rules for the guidance of the managers of the Gas Companies in laying down their pipes in the streets, several difficulties present themselves which it will be necessary to remove before any regulations can be drawn

The first of these difficulties is the want of a resolution by the Commis sion fixing the dimensions and arrange ments of the side walks and roadways in the several streets.
