FOOD SUPPLY.

Europe is no longer able to feed her opulation, and hence she exports half-a-million able-bodied emigrants yearly to America, and draws on Australia for two million preserved sheep in tins.' In this manner the equilibrium of food and, population is maintained in the Old World, and every year the increased demand for preserved meat trom Australia and South America shews that before long these countries will become immense cattle-farms to feed the European markets. For the same reason the outflow of labor from England and Germany will increase notwithstanding the efforts of the Government in those countries to check or divert emigration; and by a natural impulse, as soon as our preservéd meat becomes as well known as that of Australia, the struggling classes of Europe will turn their attention to the meat twice a week, the great proportion being little above starving point, and it is of such materials that the only dangerous revolutions are made. For such as cannot emigrate it is a

Australia is beginning to pay more attention to the raising and exporting of meat than to agricultural pursuits, as will be seen from the subjoined tables. First we give the agricultural returns for 1872, of the 7 Australian colonies: their population is almost equal to that of the Argentine Republic, say two millions, and the total number of acres under tillage shews exactly two acres per head. There are in fact 600 leagues of land under crops, in Australia, two-thirds being under wheat; this is four or five times as much as we can boast. The official re-

Another distressing case claims public compassion, of the unfortunate people sent out to Paraguay as Lincolnshire farmers. The statement of John Hayes which we give below, speaks for




