subject. The latter expressed his opinion, in reply, that no reliable proof existed of any mineral resources of such a character, adding however that he had written to M. Elie de Beaumont of Paris to procure a suitable person for making surveys and explorations to this effect.

The Governors of Rioja and Santiago are the only ones that have sent any reply to the above circular. Governor Godollo writes that Famatina, in the province of Rioja, possesses iron so abundant a quality that it may be put down at 70 to 80 per cent as the average yield...

In a subsequent communication the same Governor encloses a report from Mr. Ricardo Valdés, proprietor of the Progreso mining establishment, who expresses himself in these terms:—"In 1867 I made a tour of exploration through the Sierras known as—Mexicana, Ballos, Casa Colorada, Old Caldera, New Caldera, Cerro Oro, and Cerro Negro, in quest of iron for my reverberating works. I saw more than 200 mines, formerly worked for gold or silver and now mostly abandoned, shewing thousands of tons of metallic ores, oxides and carbonates of iron, magnetic oxides of iron and evidences that iron forms the base of all these mines, especially at Espiritu Santo, Onida, San Andrés, Santo Domingo, Santa Theresa, Puerto, Republicana, Rosario and other parts of Cerro Negro; samples gave from 65 to 86 per cent of iron.

"These mines could be easily and advantageously worked as they are near the Pacific seaboard, and there is an abundance of firewood, besides some coal-beds discovered near." Governor Luis Frias of Santiago del Estero writes that the only iron he knows of is at Cerro Ichagon, in the department of Cloya; firewood abounds for the purposes of smelting, and the place is only 6 leagues from Messrs. Lamb and Telfener's line of railway to Tucuman.

As regards the monstrous block of iron in the Chaco, which some regard as mineral and others as an aroelite, its exact locality is no longer known, and the Legislature of Santiago offers a reward of \$2,000 and 10 leagues of land to the discoverer, as by law of January 20th 1873.

THE ITALIAN BANK.

No business in this country has progressed so rapidly as banking. This is conclusively shown by the fact that, whereas twelve years ago we had only two banks, the Provincial and Maua, we have now nearly a dozen, all giving splendid dividends. The English community counts two banks, the Germans one, the Italians one, the Spaniards one, the Brazilians one, and the Argentines four, representing an aggregate capital of over £10 millions sterling.

The Italian Bank, whose balance-sheet has been recently published for the second half-year of its existence, is no exception to the prosperity attending this all-important branch of trade in so young and rising a community as Buenos Ayres. The paid-up capital of this Bank is £300,000 sterling in shares of 100 half dollars each; the business for the half year ending June 30th shews a considerable increase over the previous half-year, notwithstanding the sharp crisis through which we have been passing for the last four months.

Without troubling our readers with long tables of figures we may sum up the business done in the last half-year, as compared with the previous one, reducing currency to fuertes, thus— Dec. 1872. July 1873. Cash movement 22,074,039.61 27,740,308

of their savings, it is pretty clear that a Bank peculiarly their own, guaranteed by the names of some of the foremost capitalists, such as the present chairman, Mr. Demarelli, cannot fail to go on steadily increasing under judicious management, till it fully represents the wealth of a branch of our population whose growth is an integral part of the progress of our commerce.

MR. LANUS'S BALL.

The ball of Monday evening, at the residence of Mr. Anacarsis Lanus, was the event of the season. The rank and file of the fashion of our city were assembled there, the company including about six hundred ladies and gentlemen of the most cosmopolitan community of the world. The vast suite of saloons forming the town house of this native merchant-prince were thrown open about midnight, when the guests began to arrive, and the elegance of the arrangements was such as to remind one of what we read about Lorenzo de Medici or the classic entertainments of the Cinquecentist.

Flowers and lights, music, beauty, fashion and all the surroundings of combined wealth and taste, threw an air of brilliant luxury over the scene, which was aptly expressed by a European diplomatist present when he said that "at Madrid he had seen nothing equal to it," and such was the muster of female beauty that even old residents considered the Portenas surpassed themselves on the occasion. It was a fairy scene of Buenos Ayres under its most attractive guise, and calculated to impress the stranger with the idea that our city is "par excellence" the capital of Spanish America, the Paris of the Southern Hemisphere. Not the least agreeable feature was the variety of peoples represented, while the blending of men of all shades of politics showed that the harmony of social life was paramount for the time over all other considerations.

Frenchmen, Germans, English, Spaniards, Brazilians, Argentines, Orientals, Paraguayans, Scandinavians, Italians, Chilians, Peruvians, Venezuelans, Dutchmen, Belgians, Swiss and representatives of divers other nationalities mixed as freely as if the world had become a great Federal Republic, while the sounds of so many different tongues lent a charm almost peculiar to our city. Merchants and their wives and daughters formed the bulk of the assemblage, with a sprinkling of Government ministers, foreign diplomats and consuls; Congress deputies, bankers, estancieros and so forth.

The grand drawing-room, antesala, and three or four parlours were devoted to dancing, the band being that of the Opera-house. Promenading through the rooms and corridors, or in the covered court-yard one had occasion to admire the splendid bouquets of flowers artistically arranged, which were presented to Madame Lanus and her daughters, signifying that the present was a family fête, probably a birthday or similar anniversary; these bouquets bore the card of Mrs. Henry Fynn of Montevideo, Mrs. Galvan, Mrs. Blortondo, Mr. Jose B. Sala, Mr. Lezica, &c., and were over twenty in number.

The supper-room was decorated in the same brilliant style, and for several hours a continuous stream of guests partook of the splendid hospitality afforded, under the supervision of Mr. Sempe of the Cafe de Paris. In this manner, between the ball-room and the buffet, the hours glided by insensibly; dancing was actively kept up, and many a gentleman was unable to find his partner for an appointed quadrillo or waltz, in so numerous an assemblage. At last the first streak of dawn was the signal for departure, and with regret the guests began to tear themselves away from the scene of pleasure.

The ball was such as must leave a pleasant impression upon both the host and his guests, and if we be allowed to moralize we may observe that such reunions are admirably calculated to promote a warm feeling of good-fellowship among all classes in B. Ayres. Mr. Lanus made all of us forget the difference between Teutonic and Latin races, the traditions of monarchy or democracy, the distinction between those of us who were born in gilded salons or straw-thatched cottages, just as he made his own countrymen oblivious of political prejudices and party-feeling. The genius of Harmony which presides on such occasions is the best friend of the Republic, and our host of Monday evening is entitled to the best wishes and thanks of the community.

BARON REUTER'S ADVERTISEMENTS.

I suppose by this time that the "final cause" of the Shah's journey is an open secret. It not, then it is time to make it one. This final cause is Baron Reuter. It may be melancholy, but it is true, that the Czar, Emperor William, King I. copold, Queen Victoria, Marshal McMahon, and Emperor Francis Joseph have been, or will be, made to advertise Baron Reuter's purchase of Persia. For this is what it all really comes to. Last year this adroit and wonderful man—not satisfied with the virtual monopoly of news which he has so long enjoyed throughout Europe, obtained from the Shah what really is the sale of the Empire or Persia. It is true that the sale is under the form of a seventy years' lease—but a lease for that length of time is almost as good as a freehold. By the terms of this agreement the whole material resources of Persia are handed over to Baron Julius de Reuter—he used to be plain Mr. Reuter—for seventy years. He is to do just what he likes with it; and I suppose the

history of the world does not afford the record of such another thing as this. It confers an absolute right to supply all the means of locomotion in Persia; an almost absolute right to work all the Persian mines; a right to the monopoly in the production and manufacture of everything; and it places the whole resources of the nation at the disposal of the concessionaire.

The concession was issued at Teheran on the 25th of July, 1872. Article 1 authorizes Baron de Reuter to establish in London a company, or any number of companies, for carrying out the works specified in the concession.

Article 2 authorizes Baron de Reuter, or his associates to construct a railway between the Caspian and the Persian Gulf, as well as any other railways he may think fit. This important privilege excludes competition, and is accorded for a period of seventy years.

Article 3 extends the railway privilege to tramways, referring to articles 4, 5, and 6 for the rules to be observed in establishing and working these two kinds of lines.

Article 4 relates to the land required for the construction of railways, tramways, and the building and works connected with them. The Government land wanted will be handed over free of expense; the land belonging to private persons may be appropriated at current prices.

Article 5 allows the concessionaire the gratuitous use of the stone, sand, gravel, &c. on the Government domains which may be required in the construction and maintenance of the works.

Article 6 enacts that all the material imported by the concessionaire, or company or companies, both for railway or other purposes, shall be exempt from any duty, toll, custom, or excise whatsoever.

Article 7 stipulates that the details of the construction and working of the line shall be appended to the concession.

Article 8 demands that the sum of £40,000 be deposited as caution money in the Bank of England in the name of the Persian Government and the concessionaire.

Article 9 allots to the Government 20 per cent of the net profits resulting from the working of the lines.

An additional article stipulates that the 7 per cent. interest shall not be paid by the Government direct, but be taken from the proceeds of the customs, mines, forests and water-courses; in case of need.

Such are the contents of this notable arrangement by which one of the greatest Oriental potentates endeavors to accelerate, and so to say, Europeanize the progress of his country. When it is considered that Persia is about five times the size of Great Britain and Ireland, and is inhabited by only ten million people, the vast field she offers to commerce and industry now that she has entered upon the path of modern civilisation need not be dilated upon.

Teeming with natural resources, and situate between Europe and Asia, she is evidently destined to become one of the most important members of the great Eastern family; and as her people, by language and descent, are more closely connected with the Saxo-Germanic nations of Europe than any other Orientals, it is perhaps not too sanguine to hope that the commercial and political intercourse, which is likely to grow more and more frequent, will in course of time produce results beneficial to the approximation of races and the civilization of the world at large.

Baron de Reuter's engineers, I understand, have been at work in Persia already for some time past.—New York paper.

EDITOR'S TABLE.

We spoke with Maldonado through the Cable yesterday at 10 o'clock a.m. Everything going on delightfully, though the weather was a little boisterous.

The excitement in the public mind in reference to the terrible event of Saturday evening died out yesterday; still a curious few were to be seen hanging about the corner of Calles Maipu and Corrientes all day, looking at the five bullet marks in the wall, which are under the charge of a 'Bobby' while the affair is being investigated. The most active enquiries are being prosecuted by the Police to unravel the crime, and it is generally believed they are on the right track.

We refer in another column to the magnificent fête given on Monday evening by Don Anacarsis Lanus and his amiable partner to the 'beau monde' of this city. Nothing like it in the way of a private entertainment has been seen in this city for years. The guests numbered about 600, and the crush was very great; but the arrangements were so admirable that all enjoyed themselves to the utmost.

We received yesterday from the Mount one of the best taken photographs we have ever seen. It represents the landing of the shore end of the Cable, and amongst the figures on the beach we recognise the old familiar forms of Mr. Peil, Mr. Evans and others, but miss that of Mr. Oldham, the popular manager of the R.P. Telegraph Co. The artists are the well known firm of Bates and Co. We should like the public to call and inspect this photograph. Ours is the first copy struck off.

A friend recently returned from Patagonia, whether he had gone on a scientific expedition, brings us the sad intelligence of the death of Castimiro in battle with some unfriendly tribes near Santa Cruz. It will be remembered that Mr. Musters during his residence with the Tehuelches constantly acted as Secretary to the late Chief, whom he describes as the father of his race, and possessed of some noble qualities. His favorite pastimes were the chase and war, in which latter especially he displayed great prowess, being in fact in his way a kind of Bonaparte. His admiration was great for anyone who could come near him in deeds of daring and agility, and to this is due the high esteem he had for the adventurous young Englishman. Deceased was a man without vice; he neither smoked, drank, nor took snuff. We know but one of our numerous subscribers who can say as much.
