



When we consider that the British Government cautioned the colonists against going to Paraguay, and refused to accredit even a Consul to that country, we are the more ready to acknowledge the generosity of Mr. St. John in coming forward of his own accord and subscribing personally for so large an amount, when his diplomatic powers did not extend to Paraguay or to a case of this nature.

We feel confident that the British residents will display their accustomed liberality, and give ready response to and Itapé for timely relief.
