

Some wools now remain unsold in the market which if sold to-day at current rates would not yield the owners 20 per cent of their cost and charges. Prices have been gradually declining. They are now lower than they have been in some years. American fleece now sells at 45 to 50 cents, California at 20 to 28 cents, mestiza at 27 to 30 cents, Cape of Good Hope at
