



Last Wednesday was declared a national holiday by the President on the occasion of inaugurating the statue to General Belgrano; who first displayed Argentine colors against the Spaniards in the victorious battle of Tucuman, September 24th, 1812. The celebration passed off with much eclat, the city being decorated with flags.

The bill for moving the capital to Rosario, which had a majority of two in the House of Deputies, and four in the Senate, was vetoed by President Sarmiento last week, on the grounds that the measure was inconvenient, especially during the present war in Entre Rios, and that he would leave the matter to be treated by his successor, this being his last year of office.

THE PILCOMAYO.

There is much of romance as well as mystery about that portion of the Chaco which lies beyond the Pilcomayo, a terra incognita, of which few people know any more than that the river Pilcomayo talls into the Paraguay, a cently published by Dr. Castro Boedo land ceded him by Congress some 7 colonies.

The first Pilcomayo explorer was Juan de Ayolas, whom Mendoza, the founder of B. Ayres, sent with a force of 270 men to discover a route from Paraguay to Feru in 1536.
