Here we have in round numbers 40,000 head of cattle per annum, or about 2 in a thousand of the farmingstock of these provinces. One Indian foray would cost us as much as the whole subsidy to the 22 tribes, for besides the above 19 there are 3 that receive no cattle, but other rations. The largest subsidy is that given to Namuncura, son of the late powerful Cacique Calfucurá. Our old friend Catriel also gets a good allowance; the other names are little known, except Coliqueo, on our western border, and the Rio Quinto chiefs, Yanquetruz, Rosas, and Baigorrita. Every tribe stipulates for so many reams of paper, which is not for writing purposes, but to make cigarettes out of the tobacco; this is much nicer than chewing it like sailors, or even the vulgar practise of pipes. We note that the only chiefs who require soap are those of the Rio Quinto, Mendoza and Bermejo; but we could wish that the Government introduced this commodity gratis among the southern and western tribes.
