NEWS FROM EUROPE.

Lisbon, Oct. 8th. Professor Wise's balloon is the talk of the day. Another attempt was made at New York yesterday evening, according to a London telegram of this morning, but without success, owing to an accident which, however, they have every hope of avoiding next time. The balloon has a capacity of 600,000 cubic feet, but will only take 400,000 feet of gas, to allow of expansion; it is made of 5,000 yards of cotton, and Professor Wise thinks a current of air, resembling the Gulf Stream will take him across to Europe as easily as Mr. Green went from London to Germany, or Nadar from Paris to Hanover. Messrs. Glaisher and Coxwell are opposed to this arial current, and Teissandier maintains that more than 18,000 feet a minute it vould require a week to make the voyage, in which the wind would be sure to change and all hands be drowned. 


