ARGENTINE IRON

Report on the Iron Minerals of Catamarca discovered by Don Gabriel Romay, in the Valleys of Albogasta and High Lands of El Alto by the undersigned Practical Miner.

This mineral lies in the eastern part of the Province of Catamarca, and distant eighteen leagues from the City. The road which leads to the mineral is in a great part bad, especially the Sierra de Portezuelo...

The Mineral is distant only 14 leagues from Albogasta, which is to be a Station of the Tucuman Rail Road, now in actual construction...

This Discovery known by the name of 'Mineral Romay' is bounded on the west by Moya-Pampa, on the east by Albogasta, and on the North and South by Guay-Condo grande, and Guay-Condo chico.

The Geological formation of the earth in which it is situated is of numerous valleys, formed by a great number of round hills; the earth being of a sandy nature...

These round hills of metal do not run in veins, but are in reality ranges of pure iron ore, in a colossal abundance, and running downwards in a vertical direction, in immense bodies, without the least particle of stone.

The length of these hills composed of iron ore appears to be about a league, running from north to south, and gradually disappearing in rising grounds; the richest part of the mineral being in the space of about half a mile, in a visible and exposed state.

In these valleys there are some rivulets formed by the heavy rains, the metal appearing in both banks in a perfect state of solidity, which proves that the intervening valleys are also of iron ore.

It appears to be of a richer quality in the north part, and as if it had been deposited by some great volcanic eruption.

During the time I employed in inspecting this mineral I discovered three classes of iron ore; the first class containing 90 per cent. of pure iron; the second, which is of a greenish color, containing 60 per cent. iron and 6 per cent. silver; the third class being accompanied by cross veins of selenium of silver, which branches in all directions, imbedded in the iron.

When the selenium appears in the surface of the iron ore in narrow branches, it must terminate in regular veins of silver at a certain depth, according to geological and practical observations; this is not an illusion, whenever the selenium appears, accompanied by the iron ore, it is a sure precursor of great richness.

At this mine, so recently discovered, there appears on the surface of the earth pieces of coal, strongly resembling earth pit coal, as if ejected by a volcanic eruption, which is almost a sure indication of the existence of coal mines.

There are many fragrant and medicinal plants and herbs; many classes of resins and gums; many classes of birds—the wild turkey almost as large as the domestic; the characta, a species of black hen, having a kind of collar on the neck, and a long tail. This latter, as well as the wild turkey, is of excellent eating.

There are also the sachacaba, guanaco, &c. There is also a spotted bird which sings throughout the entire night, named by the natives ataja-caminos.

Water exists at a place called La Toma, at about three and a half miles from the Ore. But ultimately I discovered a spring of clear and excellent water at the distance of a mile, which could be easily enlarged so as to produce a large quantity of water.

I have not a knowledge of chemistry but I have seen a great many productions which belong to this science. Amongst which I discovered a chalky substance.

I was engaged by Don Gabriel Romay to make a scrupulous inspection of the newly discovered mineral, he being aware of my practical experience during many years in Chile, Peru and Argentine provinces. While employed in the above capacity, I discovered another valuable deposit of Iron Ore.

My visit was made in October, which in this country is the beginning of summer, and noted that the climate was beautiful; the temperature is cool in the mornings and evenings: there are days on which a fresh breeze blows from nine or ten in the morning until evening. The sky during my stay was seldom cloudy. Vegetation is rank and protuse. I have seen Wheat gathered which I was told had never received any rain, proving the excellence of the climate and soil.

LONDON LETTER

During the week the Bank raised the rate to 6 per cent. and almost simultaneously, the rate was raised to 6 per cent. by the Bank of France. Today, notwithstanding a little panic which occurred amongst the jobbers on the Stock Exchange in the early part of the week the Bank Directors have not thought it necessary to make any further change, and this afternoon money was procurable under the Bank rate. I cannot do better than transcribe from the Daily News the version it gives of the present position, as it epitomises the opinions which have so frequently been ventured on the subject in these letters.

I must at the same time premise that the writer in the Daily News is himself something of an alarmist and has not always the courage of his convictions. He says—'It is to be feared that there may be a disposition to exaggerate the difficulties which are making themselves felt. There is often a want of imagination in the keenest business men which makes them liable to changes from one extreme to another in opinion. They ignore the plainest facts which do not happen to be prominently on the surface, and are consequently at one time unreasonably hopeful, and then they are as unreasonably depressed when the facts which they ignored force themselves into notice and absorb all their attention. In this way the possibility of a monetary stringency in America, and all the circumstances which pointed to an approaching scarcity of gold, were decided and ignored a few months ago in spite of the plainest evidence; and now that they have come to the surface there is a vague alarm in some quarters which is unreasonable and absurd. It is quite true that the drain of gold to America, in conjunction especially with a titid demand for Germany, is a serious matter. The entire reserve of the Bank of England, which is practically the only reserve held in the country against the liabilities on deposit of all the banks, is now only 9 millions sterling. The deposits, it is calculated, exceed six hundred millions, those of the London joint-stock banks alone being upwards of a hundred millions. It is a natural reflection that the monetary position is unstable when so small a sum is held against liabilities so immense, and when demands on that reserve are impending which may reduce it one or two millions in a day, and in fact almost to zero, before anything can be done to replenish it. Another sum of two millions to America and Germany, such as was sent a fortnight ago in about four or five days, would make the reserve seven millions, or less than the amount held by the New York banks on the 13th of September, just before their panic broke out. With the chance of such a reduction before us, it is hard to say what the Bank rate may not be in a week, and what pressure may thus be put on the industrial interests of the country. But the reassuring consideration is, that the somewhat alarming state of the Bank reserve is itself, to a large extent, artificial. The bullion in the Bank, which is the real reserve, is upwards of twenty millions, and will be wholly available when the pressure on the Bank passes a certain point. But for the artificial division in the reserve which the Bank Act has made, every one would see that the Bank holds enough to stand a gigantic drain without finching, and to give ample time for the effect of any measures which may be necessary to replenish the reserve. Now there is a vague commencement of uneasiness as soon as the nominal reserve is as low as 9 millions, although the real reserve is all the while 20 millions. If it were not for the Bank Act, there would be no such uneasiness nor the slightest real cause for its existence. Should the business world, therefore, during the next few weeks be visited with the evil of a reserve falling to eight or seven millions, and consequent sharp turns of the monetary screw, they will know where to lay the blame. The cause will no doubt have been in part the artificially low rates which prevailed last August and September, but the ultimate source of the evil will be the Act which makes the slightest movement in the Bank Reserve artificially important, and thus tempts the Bank Directors into extreme and violent changes. Fortunately, the evil is for the most part only temporary, a spasm of excessively dear money conducting very quickly to cheapness, but the indirect mischiefs are nevertheless great. This tendency to extremes impedes and harasses trade by the constant uncertainty it infuses into the conditions of future engagements.

I observe in the STANDARDS come to hand to-day by the Neva that people in Buenos Ayres are sending certain bonds here for negotiation. It is, perhaps, hardly worth while to remind them that only the three or four Argentine and Buenos Ayres stocks which are quoted on our Stock Exchange can be made available in London. The stocks which are now quoted can only be accepted as collateral securities. If you are so hard up as to want not only to pawn, but to dispose of your securities, you had better apply formally to the London Stock Exchange and have them quoted.

You will find in the advertisement sheets of the London papers the long prospectuses issued by Messrs. Grant Bros., of the River Plate and Brazil Telegraph Company.

Since the examination of Captain Brown the Tichborne case has assumed an increased interest by the evidence of the steward of the Osprey, which picked up Sir Roger, and the examination occupied three days, and as far as we see his evidence has not been materially shaken. He states that he took care of him when on board the Osprey, fed him and washed him, recognising certain marks on his person, and that on their arrival at Melbourne, he, in company with others amongst the crew, and the claimant deserted the ship and made for the 'diggings'. EDITOR'S TABLE, Yesterday began a very 'Nothing new' kind of way. Weather seedy; no steamers in; no news from Europe, and things in general wretchedly dull. The Nation sent up some rockets at 11 a. m., but it was only a bulletin announcing a couple of electioneering accidents the day before. The Pacific steamer Magellan with Lisbon dates to the 28th October is expected to arrive to day, and the general impression is that her financial and political news will be of the last importance.

Sunday was fine, but the land auctions were, in general, fine fiascos. The fact is, people are sick of land auctions, and even if they were not they have no money to buy even a cabbage garden. No wonder money is tight. A statistical subscriber estimates that there are 5000 millions of 'running money' now locked up in land speculations. 'Parbleu! This is a blue look out; 5000 millions is rather a tall amount; but even if we take the half of it, and divide that by two, the idea of the 'sald' being locked up in 'bañados' is quite disturbing. More money is wanted and must be had, or the reign of Crash will come. There is some talk of asking the Chambers permission to set the lithographic press to work on 500 millions of mpc; it would be better to let the private banks emit on proper security. The cry of everyone now is 'Fiat money rat calum.'
