The Britannia Mails. LATEST FROM OHILE. Valparaiso, Nov. 10th. The Intendencia on the 31st. ult. published the following decree:

Whereas we have the sad news of the demise of the distinguished man and public benefactor William Wheelwright, who first introduced steam-navigation in the Pacific it is expedient to perpetuate our gratitude by erecting a monument in his memory.

Therefore a committee is hereby named, of Messrs. Irrazabal, Savers, Matthei, Germain, Corveró, Solari and Jackson to carry out the same. The Mercuro approves this idea, since Valparaiso already possesses a monument to Lord Cochrane, who cleared the West Coast of hostile ships, and the services of Mr. Wheelwright have been still more eminent. Captain Stewart, in the new steamer Itata, has made the quickest run from England on record, only 30 days. Near Coronel he ran into the American barque Corsair, of New Bedford, which is said to have had no lights: he rescued the crew and took her in tow, but the cable afterwards broke and she is supposed to have gone down. The crew were landed at Coronel. The Pacific Co. is building several magnificent new steamers, with the purpose of running six vessels monthly from England.

Bolivian journals contradict the alliance between Brazil and Chile, and say Pres. Ballivian circulates these stories to distract public attention. At Iquique the ill-treatment of Chilians by the Peruvian authorities caused the stoppage of 6 more factories.

It was the only mode of defence not tried, the jaw-bones of asses excepted. In any case weather-wise people regard the presence of these animals as the sign of a hard winter.

Russia has sent us an admirable 'prima donna,' but it must be in honor of Barnum's visit she has forwarded the 'Man-Dog.' This monstrosity is a man and brother, with his face so covered with hair as to resemble a Skeetier. He has a little son that takes after his papa. At home he drew or pushed carts, but, thanks to having a dog's head, he is likely to make his fortune. His proprietor is in a constant state of fever lest Jettichew should commence to lose his hair. A pomade is already called after the distinguished foreigner that professes to cast all other 'hair-restorers' into the shade. Heads as bare as a billiard ball can be re-covered with Hyperion curls. The age of wigs is past. M. Jett-cetera smokes his pipe like a Dutchman, but is said to detest cats like all his tribe. 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The Pacific steamer Cordillera is expected to arrive at Montevideo to-day with Lisbon dates to the 4th inst. Intense anxiety exists here about the Bank note, the Bourbon restoration and Bazaine. The impression is that the Republicans will run Henry the Fifth very tight. A deeply and skillfully laid plot to commit a burglary at Durazno in the Banda Oriental has just been frustrated. The attempt was to have been made on the Railway Work Office of Messrs. Waring Brothers on a day when it was supposed that a considerable amount of money would be deposited there, to meet the monthly pay which was then falling due. The intention seems to have been to carry out the scheme by means of the joint agency of drugging the persons living on the premises, and opening the office door and safe with false keys. The information laid before the authorities being of a nature to satisfy them that the matter was of serious importance, the suspected man, named Thomas Glaudon, who worked in the yard, was at once arrested, and concealed in his room were found a file and a key filed down to fit the office door, with three other false keys exact models of those of the safe; two of these had been broken apparently in a previous attempt to open the safe; but the third was whole, and some wax was found bearing the impressions of both the broken and entire keys. The evidence of a chemist living in Durazno proves that the man Glaudon had endeavored to purchase bella donna at his shop, saying it was for the use of Mr. Wingate, the resident engineer, who with his wife resides at the railway offices, but was very properly refused. We trust that the authorities may sift this matter to the bottom for the purpose of discovering whether there are any accomplices implicated in the plot, it being by no means agreeable to reflect that we have had (without being aware of it) celebrities of the kind, who are evidently well up in the science and practice of their calling, roaming at large among us; as we had previously fondly hoped that the more skilled members of the profession who had graduated in European schools had not yet honoured the River Plate with a visit.

Telegrams from the Mount yesterday report a disgraceful row at the bull fight at the Union on Sunday. Our worthy neighbours ought to get rid of this brutal and degrading amusement as soon as possible. It has rained heavily all over the Banda Oriental and the camps have greatly improved. It is suspected that poor Mr. Mathew McEachen was murdered by one of his shearers with whom he had some words. The new Lisbon paper, The Telegrapho Europeo, promises to return adequate parts of their subscriptions to those who pay in advance, in case it should burst up before they get value for their money. Here is a paper that believes in its own resources and the mutability of human affairs!

The want of passenger cars to the business trains every morning from Flores is still painfully felt. Mr. Huergo, we wish to ask you a plain question. Are the Public to wait for redress till some broker, banker, bar-raquero, or editor (Heaven forefend) tumbles off the 'balcon' on which he is forced to stand and is picked up in two pieces? 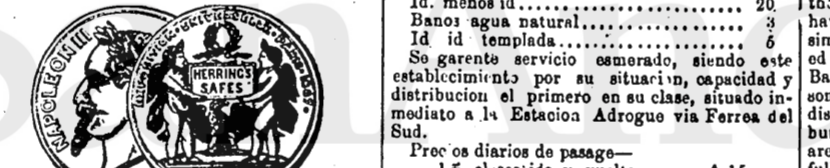

Municipalidad de la Ciudad. LICITACION.

El Consejo de Gobierno llama a licitacion verbal para adquirir la calle de Colles, desde su arranque en el Paseo Julio hasta la calle de Rivadavia, la calle de Entre Rios hasta la calle de Caseros y la calle Caseros hasta unirse con la calle de San Martin y Corrales de Abastacido.
