THE MACKINNON CLAIM.

The claimants Alexander and Chas. Mackinnon, whose names are now causing such notice in the upper ranks of European society, are familiarly known to most people in Montevideo and Buenos Ayres, the first being Commissioner for the last Oriental loan in London, and his brother Charles a gentleman of ample means and good standing in the sister city.

The brothers Mackinnon are grandsons of Mr. Alexander Mackinnon, banker and Admiralty prize agent at Naples in the last century; this gentleman appears to have been robbed of £40,000 by the notorious Lady Hamilton, whose name and character brought such discredit upon the hero of the Nile and Trafalgar.

All efforts by Mr. Mackinnon to obtain redress from his own Government proving unsuccessful, he emigrated to Buenos Ayres in 1808, bought a quinta close to town, and there some years later, leaving his son, Charles Villiers Mackinnon, the heir to a reduced patrimony.

The present claimants are sons of the last named, and as natives of Montevideo solicit the support of the Oriental Government in making good their demand for said £40,000 against King Victor Emmanuel as legal representative of Ferdinand IV. of Naples, who despoiled and imprisoned their grandfather.

Alexander Mackinnon was descended from the Mackinnons of Strath, his father having rented part of the island of Arran called Corrie-Chrevie, for which reason he was sometimes called Jon-Og of Corry. He was educated at Glasgow, under Adam Smith, especially in financial matters, and then sent to an English commercial house in Leghorn. He married a lady of his own clan in 1792, and settled the following year in Naples, opening a banking-house in that city with Rev. Alexander Macaulay, and acting also as Judge of the British Admiralty prize court.

Nelson was in the zenith of his fame, Ferdinand IV. was King and had for Ministers Count Acton and the Prince Castellecchia. The real ruler of Naples, however, was Lady Hamilton, wife of the English Ambassador; she was of Welsh extraction and had been picked up in the streets of London by a quack-doctor named Graham, who exhibited her as Hygeia or the Goddess of Health, until she fell into the hands of Sir W. Hamilton who was 50 years her senior and married her.

Lady Hamilton found occasion to do her banking business with Mackinnon, until the latter thought her Ladyship's drafts too frequent, whereupon his partner Macaulay and Lady Hamilton laid him by the heels in Castel del Ovo, seized all his property to the value of £40,000, and threatened to send him to the galleys if he gave any more trouble. At last he escaped from the fortress by means of a basket, and made his way to England. His case had been put through a kind of trial at Naples in presence of the British Ambassador and 6 English jurymen, but he had protested against Sir W. Hamilton and his jury, demanding rather to be tried by the laws of Naples. Count Acton did not seek to counteract the measures of Lady Hamilton in the matter; nor did Prince Castellecchia, and the King said if they would not trouble him he cared little how the case was decided.

Count Acton was son of an English doctor in Besancon and early entered the French navy, subsequently passing into the Tuscan service. While a mere youth he was sent in command of 4 frigates to help the Spaniards before Algiers, and his conduct there opened for him a brilliant career. Prince Castellecchia was at one time Ambassador to London, when Mackinnon advanced him £7,500. Both these Ministers appear to have feared the influence of Lady Hamilton.

Mackinnon presented 44 petitions to the King of Naples for redress, but as the historian of Lady Hamilton confesses—the unhappy English banker in Castel de Ovo had fallen under the displeasure of Her Ladyship. After his escape to England he was equally unfortunate in his demands for justice. Mr. Canning refused to interfere in a case already decided by Her Majesty's Ambassador at Naples.

Following the dates as closely as possible we find that Mr. Mackinnon settled in Naples in 1793, was imprisoned in 1795, escaped to England and vainly appealed for justice till 1808, came to B. Ayres and was enrolled as a citizen in 1812, and died in 1816.

During his imprisonment at Castel de Ovo some one sent him a present of a basket of fruit, of which he was about to eat when the jailer snatched the fruit from him, throwing it to a dog, which soon died in convulsions. The manner in which he got out of the fortress was this: concealed in a basket of clothes, a stout porter carried the basket through the castle-gate, and not knowing its contents put it on the parapet of a bridge, where the wind caused it to oscillate, until the porter proceeded on his errand and the prisoner reached a place of safety.

Mackinnon, with his little boy, made his way to London. By his second wife he had three children, and on his death his slaves buried him in his own quinta, there being no cemetery for Protestants in Buenos Ayres. His son seems to have despaired of obtaining justice from the Bourbons; but the grandsons have better expectations from Victor Emmanuel, and as the case seems well supported by history, we hope they may succeed in getting that justice which was denied their grandfather. As Victor Emmanuel has taken the assets and property of the Bourbon Kings of Naples, he is bound by Roman and modern law to answer for their debts and obligations. Perhaps at any other moment the Mackinnon brothers would have less chance than now, but as sundry Italian claims are about to be arranged and acknowledged by the M. Videan authorities, it is only natural the Italian Government should now more readily lend an ear to so well founded a claim.

SOUTH AMERICAN CLUB.

The inaugural banquet of this Club was to come off at Willis's Rooms on Nov. 28, at 7 p.m., according to the invitations signed by Mr. Joseph Green, Hon. Sec., who sends us a fresh list of seven members enrolled. There were seven members invited to the dinner, and we may expect a report of the speeches by next mail. LATEST FROM NEW YORK.

(From the Times of the 31st October).

In finance there is a considerably better feeling than there has been for some time past. There is an uneasy belief prevalent, however, that the financial derangement is going to have a permanently depressing effect upon general trade. Our shopkeepers are complaining of dullness, and in manufacturing establishments there are evidences of retrenchment.

A telegram from Louisville announces that the manufacturers there are discharging their hands to a considerable extent. The Louisville rolling mills were suspended for a week, but have since resumed operations. At Fall River, Massachusetts, the Manufacturers' Board of Trade have recommended that, for the present, all mills suspend work on two days of each week, and during the other four days work but eight hours daily. At Woonsocket, Rhode Island, the impression is that all the mills will hereafter reduce to half time. In Philadelphia and its neighbourhood there is no general reduction of time, but there have been partial discharges of workmen from several large establishments. In one iron foundry there was an attempt to reduce wages 20 per cent., but it was met with a strike, which ultimately was compromised at 10 per cent. reduction. Gold, on October 10th, at one time touched 107½, the lowest point since 1862. This decline in the gold premium prompts an almost universal discussion of the probability of a return to specie payments, and the propounding of divers theories which their inventors think will hasten that event.

One of the serious effects of the panic will be the reduction in the Government revenues. The imports have decreased, and will continue to do so, this means a shrinkage in the Customs receipts. There is some fear that for the current fiscal year, ending June 30, 1874, the revenues may not be sufficient to meet the appropriations made by Congress. An agitation has already begun with the object of securing, at the approaching Session of Congress, reduced appropriations, so as to meet squarely the reduced revenue, and avoid any increase of taxation. The decreased imports begun to show decidedly in September, when 30½ millions arrived in New York, compared with over 36 millions in September, 1872. At the same time, for the nine months of 1873 which have passed, the imports have amounted to 315½ millions compared with 350½ millions for the corresponding nine months of 1872. The New York Customs revenues thus far in 1873 are not quite 96 millions, whereas last year at this time they were nearly 114 millions. On the other hand, our export trade is swelling. The New York exports for September were over 27 millions, while for September, 1872, they reached but 21 millions; and for the nine months of 1873 and 1872 they are respectively 257 and 225 millions. This decrease in imports and increase in exports shows a balance of trade in our favour, and explains the decline in sterling exchange. The New York Journal of Commerce is jubilant at the prospect; declares that the tide of gold must flow towards America, and announces that the balance of trade being in our favour, "the sovereigns of Great Britain must melt their pride in the crucibles of the American mint."

In this connexion it may be mentioned that the Bureau of Statistics at Washington has made up the official report of the trade of the entire country for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1873. The figures are the following, compared with the previous year:

THE MONARCHICAL RESTORATION.

Paris, Oct. 30, Evening.

The Comte de Chambord has addressed the following letter to M. Chesnelong:—

"Salzburg, Oct. 27.

"Sir,—I have preserved so pleasant a recollection of your visit to Salzburg, I have conceived so great an esteem for your noble character, that I do not hesitate to address myself to you as frankly as you came to me. For many long hours you spoke with me of the destinies of our well-beloved country, and I know that on your return you spoke in the midst of your colleagues words which will earn you my eternal gratitude. I thank you for having so well understood the anguish of my heart, and for having concealed nothing as regards the firmness of my decisions. I was not affected when public opinion, carried away by a current which I deplore, alleged that I at last consented to become the Legitimist King of a Revolution. I possessed as

The Senate Committee on the Cheap Transportation Routes, which was created to satisfy the demand of the 'Patrons of Husbandry,' has been taking testimony quite industriously for some time past. It is announced that it will report in favor of three water-line routes from the West to the sea-board, as meeting the necessity for cheap transportation. One of these is central, and the others in the north and south, but the special locations have not yet been definitely determined upon. The southern route, it is understood, will be the proposed Fort St. Philip Canal, which is projected to connect the Mississippi, below New Orleans, with the Gulf of Mexico, so as to avoid the dangers and obstructions at the passes at the mouths of the river. The estimated cost of this, which will be a ship canal, is six million dollars. A very large interest in the West and in the Mississippi Valley urges this improvement. The central route selected, probably, will be the partially completed James River and Kanawha Canal, which starts from the James at Richmond, Virginia, crosses the mountains, and terminates at the Kanawha River, a tributary of the Ohio, in West Virginia.

For the Northern route three projects are urged—the Champlain Canal, connecting the Hudson River with Lake Champlain, and thence to the St. Lawrence; the Erie Canal; and a ship canal around Niagara Falls. The widening and improvement of the two former are suggested. The Committee in its recommendations will incline in favour of canals, water transportation being obviously much cheaper than that by railroad. It does not follow, however, that their report will condemn the railroad freight charges as exorbitant without cause. Much testimony has been taken on this topic, and the railroad men have managed to make a very gloomy exhibit, showing that very few lines in the West are earning enough money to pay dividends. Out of 50 railroad corporations in Illinois, but five pay dividends, and in Iowa and Missouri affairs are much the same. Transportation charges over these lines may be high, but they are made so by the necessity of meeting expenses.

The yellow fever at Memphis appears to be at a stand. The deaths average about 40 daily, and numbers of new cases are constantly developed. The weather has got warmer, and this discourages the people. The distress is extreme, and the demand for assistance general. At Shreveport,
