VICTORY IN ENTRE-RIOS.

WIND UP OF JORDAN.

The second Entre-Rios war seems at last over, and every province in the Republic will rejoice at the announcement. About noon yesterday the church bells were set ringing, and rockets let off, to celebrate the important news of Col. Gainza's complete victory over Lopez Jordan, the details of which, as contained in the official report, are as follows :-

Field of battle, Don Gonzalo, Tuesday 11 p.m. Minister of War to the President of Republic.

To-day, after a march of 10 leagues. I came up with Jordan's army, which consisted of 5,000 or 6,000 men, including great masses of cavalry and 5 battalions of infantry, besides 8 fieldpieces. We have obtained a complete victory, having killed or taken prisoner all the enemy's infantry, of whom several were drowned or missing. We have also taken all their artillery, six or seven flags, and a quantity of arms and ammunicion abandoned by the fugitives. Their cavalry fled in all directions, and if I had an hour more of daylight I must have captured Lopez Jordan, who escaped across

the stream with only 40 followers. Our infantry behaved with their usual bravery, and kept up a galling fire with Remington rifles upon the enemy, while our cavalry lanced them in flank. No less remarkable was the good service done by our artillery and

Nat. Guard cavalry. The contest was long and arduous with a deadly fire that lasted over 3 hours. The enemy made several efforts to double our right and left flanks, and take us in the rear, but our 2nd Batt, of the Line did its duty well in covering our rear. We have to regret some losses; the brave Levalle wounded in the leg, Majors Zapata and Machado also wounded, after gallant fighting; several soldiers among the

DETENTION OF THE CUYABA

"Public armed and commissioned ships are exempt from the jurisdic-"tion of local tribunals and authori ties; but private vessels are not · exempt from local jurisdiction unless "by express compact, and to the ex-"tent of such compact."

It is not easy to determine whether the Cuyaba be of the first or the second category, since at first sight she seems to come under the class of a great way towards solving the most 'private vessels,' but then she is also a Brazilian mail-steamer and carries an officer wearing the imperial uni-

This is the reason that some people compare the present case with the seizure of the Trent by the S. Jacinto, when the British Government declared it considered an affront to its mail-steamer the same as if done to a man of war. That case was, however, very different since it occurred on the high seas; and if the U. States authorities had seized Slidell and Mason in the port of New Orleans aboard the Trent, very possibly the American Government would have asserted local jurisdiction and refused to give them up. 




