St. Patrick's Society.

The special general meeting of this society was held on Thursday night, Mr. T. ARMSTRONG in the chair, assisted by the two Vice-Presidents, the Treasurer, Assistant-Secretary, and the following Directors:—Messrs. Barry, Connor, Denehy, Lowe, Dr. Kelly, E. Casey, Rodgers, T. St. G. Armstrong, Pippet, E. Murphy, Cowan, Donovan, Lynch, &c.

The Secretary read the minutes. Mr. Rodgers stated that in the report of his speech, at the last meeting, there were some slight errors which he desired corrected.

The Chairman considered Mr. Manning out of order in reading a reported speech which Mr. Rodgers himself wished to be corrected.

The Secretary next read the following letter from Messrs. H. A. Green & Co.:

Thomas Armstrong, Esq., President of the St. Patrick's Society, present.

Referring to the letter addressed to your late Secretary, the Rev. Father Walsh, under date October 23rd last, and to an interview we have recently had with your Assistant Secretary, Mr. J. P. Browne, we beg to say that we are agreeable to issue tickets at £12 sterling for any steamer passages which your Society may apply for here in writing, and that Messrs. Lamport and Holt are willing to bring out steamer passengers at the same rate in any of their steamers (payment in both cases on delivery of ticket) providing such passengers present an order from any of the Society's duly authorised agents in the United Kingdom.

Messrs. L. & H. reserve to themselves the right to limit the number of such passengers in any one of their steamers.

In reducing the rate to so low a sum, it is understood that all brought out under the auspices of the St. Patrick's Society come in Messrs. L. & H.'s steamers, and as our general rate of prepaid passage money here is so much above £12, it must also be distinctly understood that applications be made at the instance of those directly connected with the Society only.

The Chairman stated that no passages could be ordered abroad for account of this society, and that so long as Mr. Thos. Duggan as Treasurer, and Mr. James Browne as Secretary, had charge of the passage business, he himself would be personally responsible for all passages ordered by the society. (Cheers)

A list of missing parties drawn up by the British Consul and sent to the society was read; no one present knew the parties. Enquiries to be made of the country directors.

The special committee named to enquire into the advisability of changing the rooms reported that the landlord would not rescind the lease. Mrs. Fortune offered to rent part of the rooms for \$2,000 per month. It was arranged that the porter continue as heretofore, and that the spare rooms be let to Mrs. Fortune.

The question of Secretary was brought forward. Mr. Rodgers spoke to the question and proposed Mr. Cowan as candidate for the vacant post.

The Chairman hinted at the necessity of economy being practised.

SWISS RIFLE CLUB.

On Sunday morning 150 members of the B. Ayres Club accompanied by a splendid band of music proceeded on board the steamer Saturno to meet the Club from Montevideo.

After landing they marched to the Café Paris where a sumptuous breakfast awaited them, and was done justice to. At 8.10 a.m. they started for Belgrano and the official reception of the Societies from Montevideo, San Nicolas and San Carlos took place at the Swiss hall. The President of the Society, Don Guillermo Matti, delivered a most appropriate inauguration speech and afterwards received the colors or the respective flag-bearers. The shooting commenced at 12 o'clock and was kept up with great spirit until 6 p.m.

Respecting the Hall, there are few so well arranged, it contains shooting hall, banquet hall, committee room, refreshment room, kitchen and the necessary accommodation for the steward of the place. The grounds were decorated with flags of all nations. Near the entrance of the hall stood, the stand prizes all selected for the occasion, some of them of considerable value.

The riflemen, when firing, are under cover, and are completely protected from rain and sun. There are nine targets; the range is 333 yards; no rest allowed.

Flores Island and Ensenada are sufficient to breed plagues even if all passengers sent there were healthy. It is time to adopt some remedy.

Of course it is too late for the present season to begin a Lazaretto to Martin Garcia or elsewhere. But we may observe that the Edward Everett and other idle vessels at the 'Igre' would answer for floating lazarettoes, if towed down to Martin Garcia; instead of crowding hundreds of wretches into a hulk at Ensenada and condemning them to drink bad water.

The tribunals of a country naturally take cognizance of any offences committed within its territory. Yet even here a difficulty arose between British and American juriconsults, in a case of murder where a man standing in Canada shot another that was on United States ground. In which country was the crime committed?

We could multiply instances to show that diplomatists may often do, as O'Connell used to say about Acts of Parliament; drive a coach-and-four through the definitions and principles of International Law.

It is difficult to lay down the law of right and wrong in matters where the ablest diplomatists are at issue. But a little good-temper and patience goes a great way towards solving the most intricate questions. When two people begin to talk of gunboats there is at first grave fear for a rupture, but a little cool reflection often brings things to rights again. Let us hope that the Cuyaba will prove a more harmless difficulty than the Marques de Olinda.

This is the reason that some people compare the present case with the seizure of the Trent by the S. Jacinto, when the British Government declared it considered an affront to its mail-steamer the same as if done to a man-of-war. That case was, however, very different since it occurred on the high seas; and if the U. States authorities had seized Slidell and Mason in the port of New Orleans aboard the Trent, very possibly the American Government would have asserted local jurisdiction and refused to give them up. In fact we everyday see fugitives from justice arrested in the port of Buenos Ayres or Montevideo on board the Royal mail-steamer; but in such cases, too, the local authorities make it a practise to get a warrant from the British Consul.

The question becomes complicated when, as in the present case, the crime is of a political character. If Rivarola were a common burglar the case would assume a different aspect. When Rosas took refuge aboard an English war-steamer they would hardly have thrown the Aegis of the British flag over him if he were a run-away convict. The case of Major Kostzka in 1849 reminds us how far neutral flags condone any political offence: Kostzka was a Hungarian insurgent leader, fled into Turkey solicited to become an American citizen and obtained an American passport, but was arrested by the Austrian authorities at Trieste and thrown into prison. The American Minister demanded his release, and on refusal ordered the U. States war-steamer to beat to quarters and point her guns on the city. The Austrian authorities then handed over Major Kostzka to the French Minister. Suppose in the present case that Col. Rivarola threw himself on the protection of the Brazilian Legation at Asuncion, or became a Brazilian citizen in his recent trip to Mato Grosso; would not the Brazilian Government have to protect him as the Americans did Major Kostzka.

On the other hand the Argentine Government has a fair pretext for declaring that the Cuyaba has broken her neutrality by carrying a rebel leader of some note. The best commentators assert that a neutral vessel violates her neutrality as much by carrying an enemy's general as if she conveyed a regiment of soldiers. And it can hardly be supposed the captain was ignorant of the nature of his passengers, and of Mr. Rivarola's recent performance before La Paz.

The French tribunals, in 1832, actually seized and confiscated the steamer Carlo Alberto which had on board the Duchess de Berri and some adherents, having put into a port near Marseilles in distress. But, in that case the steamer had been expressly chartered to convey the adventurers for the purpose of trying to get up a revolution. In the present case the Cuyaba is a regular trader, without any evil intentions against the Government, and had never received any prohibition against carrying Rivarola, Lopez Jordan or anybody else.

At the close of the rebellion in Canada a case occurred which at one moment almost threatened a war between the United States and England. An Englishman who had hurried a Canadian vessel with several insurgents on board, in American waters, was arrested by the authorities of New York to be tried for murder, as regarded the persons who perished by his act. The British Minister demanded his surrender, but the New York authorities refused. Finally the jury disagreed, and the Englishman was released.

As a rule, the jurisdiction of a country includes all its ports and the seaboard to a distance of cannon-shot, say 3 or 5 miles. Nevertheless the American tribunals refused to recognize the jurisdiction or 'lex loci' in the case of the Newton at Antwerp and another vessel, whose name we can't remember, at Marseilles. In each case one of the sailors wounded another on board, and both the United States Consul and the local authorities claimed jurisdiction in the cause. The American tribunals held it was a matter of ship discipline, in which the local authorities should not interfere unless requested by the Consul.

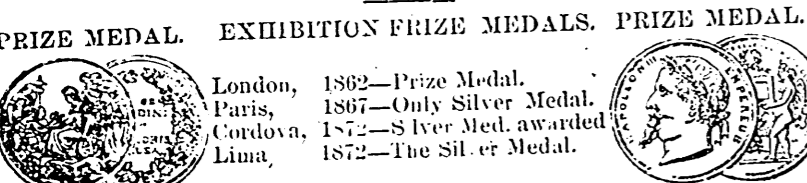

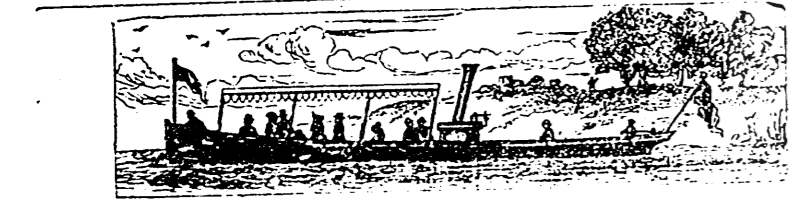

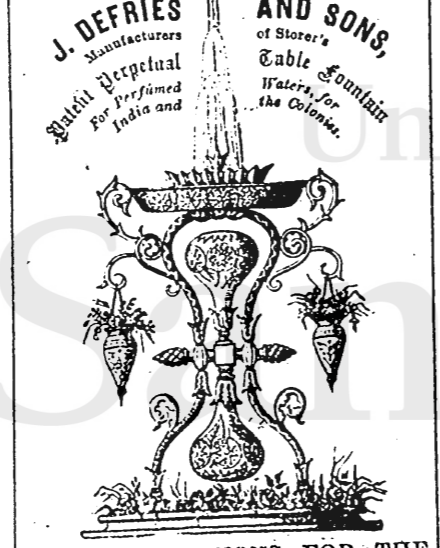
