The adjourned meeting of the National Bank will come off on Monday next. The Coliseum has been selected for the occasion, but we have serious doubts as to that time-honored edifice being large enough to hold the shareholders, without danger to their ribs in the squeeze. Shareholders have to-day, to-morrow and the next day for registering their votes and proxies in the Secretary's office; on Monday a King's ransom cannot get a vote registered.

We would not say a word if any reasonable grounds existed for their clapping on quarantine last week; but the fact of a lot of emigrants dying from having eaten rotten rotten, bacalao is no valid cause for the extreme funk displayed at go-ahead M.V.

The Ladies Bazaar, at the American Church, was opened yesterday. The stalls were tastefully arranged, and well filled with choice wares of every kind. The attendance was most numerous and fashionable. The Bazaar will be continued to-day and to-morrow.

EMIGRATION TO PARAGUAY.

Sir, I have read with surprise the letter Señor Don Gregorio Benites has addressed to you in reply to mine of the 24th inst., but I rejoice, at all events, to see the satisfactory declaration by him as to the safety and position of the English emigrants to Paraguay, thus removing all ground for anxiety about them.

I again deny that the emigration to Paraguay was, in any sense, "an industrial speculation," while Señor Benites' only ground now for his assertion is that remuneration was given to the agents who were employed to go about the country to arrange for and bring emigrants to the shipping ports, to select and purchase a mass of stores, ship them, and despatch the people. Such remuneration, however, is not so large as asserted by him, and was in fact only a reasonable remuneration for the stipulated services.

Señor Benites now admits that the contracts I made were in the name of the Government, and were ratified by him. But it is quite untrue that "I had no power whatever to that effect," and the following shows the contrary:

1. I held full powers (as complete as Señor Benites' own) ample for the issue of the loan for the Government, and likewise to dispose of its proceeds, partly for emigration, and for other purposes as contemplated by the law of Congress.

2. In addition, for my guidance regarding emigration, I received from the Government Emigration Department at Asuncion an official copy of the Act of "Concessions" to be granted to emigrants, dated Asuncion, 6th June, 1872, specially addressed to me, confirmed by the present Minister of the Interior, bearing his personal signature and the seal of his Ministry.

3. I also received from different members of the Government, including the President himself, various despatches respecting emigration.

4. I from time to time advised the Government of the progress I was making in carrying out the emigration from France and England; also the progress making for the establishment of the National Bank in Paraguay, and about the other matters entrusted to my care.

Fuallly I gave in my despatch of the 11th of August, 1872, a full report of what I had done about emigration, advising the Government therein of the appointment by me of Messrs. Seymour, Anglo and others to conduct the arrangements.

It is idle, therefore, to pretend that the Government were not fully aware of everything, as I have the usual proofs of the receipt of my despatches at Asuncion; and for Sr. Benites to oppose now to the above, as "the best proof he can give" of the alleged want of authority on my part, extracts from some letter he may have received, dated the 12th of December, 1872, and still more from one dated only the 9th of September last, is futile.

letter that the agreements actually stipulate, as in that of Mr. Anglo, the first in order of date (the 1st August, 1872), the following:—"The said Mr. Anglo undertakes on his part to proceed to Assuncion by the mail of the 19th or 21st inst. next, and, on arrival, to make arrangements with the Government of Paraguay for the due and proper housing and rationing of all emigrants sent out," etc.

Mr. Seymour's arrangement, dated August 2, 1872, has a provision to the like import, after which it is mere trifling with words for Señor Benites to seek to deny that the agents were not to submit themselves to the authorities of Paraguay.

Respecting Mr. Baillie's agreement, dated Aug. 28th 1872, his duty was chiefly to be to Rosario to see that proper river steamer arrangements were ready for promptly transporting the emigrants up to Assuncion, and it was necessary that he should take instructions in proper time from some one on this side whenever steamers were despatched from England carrying emigrants. The allusion, therefore, to Mr. Baillie is not in point.

Those gentlemen each took from me a letter of credential to the Government, as advised in my despatch of the 11th of August, 1872.

I do not advert to my ceasing to be the representative of Paraguay here otherwise than to say that I had the great misfortune to bring it upon myself because I hesitated to hand over the money proceeds of the loan to Sr. Benites without control.

I shall not trouble you again on this matter, having occupied so much space in this reply, but I invite the Paraguayan Government to publish all the correspondence between myself and them in connection with the affairs of Paraguay, so as to show on which side there is truth.

Thanking you in anticipation for the insertion of this letter.

There was a drop in the Cedula market and a rise in the bond market to-day. Business ruled dull. Cedulae were very freely offered for the end of the month, but the market nevertheless was bought very freely for the end of December and January, and but for the pinch the shipment of gold per Nevada caused the market would doubtless show better. It seems that the exact amount of specie shipped in Nevada was \$90,000 as informed at the agency, but \$130,000. We took every care possible to give the correct figure, and are not responsible for the error.

The best news of the day was the raising of the quarantine to-morrow by the Montevideo Government: every one approves of the step; the quarantine on vessels from Rio still holds at 12 days, it seems that at Montevideo there is something said against putting the Lazzaretto on Flores Island, first because it is too near shore, and secondly because they claim the Island as Oriental. As regards the revolutionary movement several fresh arrests were made to-day in Montevideo.

The Saturno remains until to-morrow, the Silex from the Mount may be looked for on Friday morning.

The following rather startling statistical facts have been laid before us by a local firm of Produce Brokers, and we consider as well worth the consideration of our commercial friends interested in the trade of the Province.

Total 340,000 Hides. By Nevada sailing this day we can only announce the sale of 9,000 ox and cow hides of this Province, and have no sale or contract of Rio hides to communicate.

The following from the Pall Mall Gazette 17th November received per Leopold II is most important as showing the state of the London money market at the latest date:

"This week has witnessed the culmination of the great pressure for money and the highest rates paid for advances since the "Black Friday" panic of 1866, but happily all concerned are important, both in financial and commercial circles have been so far equal to the strain, that the latter means of communication that have been established in the interval between one centre and another. The bullion tide may be said to have returned on the 10th inst., since which date gold has steadily flowed in, and at the moment there is a good prospect of its continuing to do so.

The New York exchange rate is not quite so firm, and there is another circumstance deserving of attention, viz., that the open market rates which cost the Bank so much to bring up to a gold-attracting-point are rather short bills. The Bank stands now probably minus the stocks which were before available as its reserve for absorbing the supply outside while the money is back in its old place. If the influx of gold were to slacken, the importance of this feature would become apparent now that the Contract value of money is higher than when our rates first entered upon high figures.

There is much said on "Change about the proposed list of proposed bank directors published daily in the papers; yesterday a list embracing 30 names was published. The people who so ingeniously got up these lists seem to think that any business man in town is qualified to be a bank director; this is a very grave error.

It is really extraordinary how successful some parties are in introducing new articles in this market. The firm of Baillie & Gomez is an instance of this, as an American firm and importing houses it is perhaps the largest now in the Plate; the firm holds now no less than 3 warehouses, and still such is the gigantic growth of their trade that they are looking for larger premises.
