EMIGRATION TO PARAGUAY.

I have read with surprise the letter Señor Don Gregorio Benites has addressed to you in reply to mine of the 24th inst., but I rejoice, at all events, to see the satisfactory declaration by him as to the safety and position of the English emigrants to Paraguay, thus removing all ground for anxiety about them.
