REPUBLIC OF URUGUAY.

NOTES BY A PORONGOS SETTLER.

The Republic of the Uruguay has suffered greatly during the past seven vears, but these young countries have marvellous amount of vitality in them, and spring up again more vis gorous than ever after each reverse. That this country will do so I make no question, but it is best, always to look the truth straight in the face and meet it boidly; there is no gainsaying the fact that at present her resources are greatly crippled, and that it is only by extraneous aid that she can struggle through her present difficulties; her liabilities become greater each year and her revenue is decreasing; and this decrease is not a mere temporary affair, it is the result of a long series of bad years, mis government and waste. But it is not too late yet to retrieve all this.

Former Governments have shown themselves very auxious to promote what they have considered the advancement of the country, railways, telegraphs and good roads 'in the vicinity of the capital' but the staple interests of the country have been left to look after themselves, and have been burdened with that most suicididal of all sources of revenue, export duties. If the country be prosperous Government need trouble itself very little about railways &c., they will come of themselves. 
