EMIGRATION TO SANTA FE.

REPORT OF THE ROSARIO COMMITTEE

The total number of arrivals in 1873 at Rosario was 15,120, and of persons who left that port 10,107, leaving a balance of 5,013 as the net immigration during the year. Of this last number it appears all paid their own passage except 1851 persons brought take at least 15 years. out by companies or for one or other if the colonies. Although the immigrants so brought out were from the poorer classes of Europeans it is shewn that 88 per cent could read and write, a proof of the civilizing influence of colonization in the province of Santa Fe, which boasts to day no fewer than 30 flourishing colonies.

The arrivals in 1873 were almost louble the preceding year, and came by 681 steamers (including river boats), the proportion of nationalities being as

The committee report that the best class of immigrants are the Piednontese and other Italians from the north. The Germans and English are generally well-informed, especially in nachinery. The French make good much wanted and could command high wages, but only 67 arrived in the year. Agriculture offers such inducements for the men that any sober tarmer can raise two crops yearly, of 20-fold each

No less than 77 per cent. of the immigrants belong to the agricultural class, which explains how easily they find employment, and how rapidly the growth of wheat is increasing. Meantime the works of the Tucuman railway absorbed about 30 per cent, of the otal, while an equal number remained in or about Rosario, and 40 per ent. made their way to Santa Fé and the Swiss colonies. It appears that 89 per cent. were Roman Catholics, and 11 per cent. Protestants.
