THE RIVER PLATE COWS.

Falmouth, April 23, 1874.

Dear Sirs, In the first place I have to thank you for the STANDARDS which have so printed.

I send you by this mail a copy of the Falmouth Packet, which contains as good an account as I could give you of the animals landed.

The North being the first Argentine steamer arriving at this port, it was a satisfaction to me that, as Consul, I could be of assistance to the consignees and captains Main and Muir, for having been some years in the River Plate and connected with a respected estanciero fainily, and knowing something of cattle and sheep thereand here-I ventured to give my opinion. The North went out in 26 days, and

to make it pay, she ought to come home in that time, as the loss of animals occurred atter the steamer had been 26 days out, on her homeward passage. The North brought 65 head of cattle, 350 sheep, and 10 horses.

The cattle were landed in fair condition, considering the long passagesome 42 days-but evidently some of them were 'bueyes,' as they were mansos.

Inc spring in England has been a good one, and hot weather has set in, and grass will be strong; and the myers of the cattle should be able to turn them out and fatten them for the fail of the year. They are heavy bulrocks and will put on flesh; and meat is worth now, from 75s to 80s per cwt.


