THE UPPER URUGUAY.

When the news became known on Tuesday that a conflict had occurred at the village of Alvear between the natives of that place and a Brazilian gunboat, which is said to have resulted in the bombardment of the village, the utmost uncertainty prevailed as to its locality. Some even asserted that it was a hamlet on the banks of the Paraná, but it was generally understood to be in the Misiones territory.

Our first impulse was to search De Moussy; he does not mention the place in any of his three volumes. Neither is it marked in the Argentine Atlas, although villages of fifty or sixty inhabitants are there to be found. We next searched the Census-report of 1869, which minutely defines every province, department and district in the whole Republic, but there is no mention of Alvear. At last we found it in the Railway-map by Sr. Moneta published last year, where it appears at the mouth of the Agupay, abreast of Paso de Itaquy, on the Argentine bank of the Uruguay, a few miles higher up than the village of Santa Cruz.

Misiones is so little known to the general reader that we must describe its general outline in order to convey an accurate idea of the scene of the affray. The Census-report gives it an area of 20,000 square miles, with a scanty population of 5000 souls; a country nearly half the size of England, where Azara found 33 flourishing settlements with 60,000 inhabitants in the last century, but now almost destitute of population, rich only in natural products, and offering an exhaustless field of flora and fauna as yet undiscovered to the scientific world.

Misiones is bounded on the north by Brazilian forests inhabited by wild Indian tribes who are descended from the savage Mamelucos of the last century; on the east by the Uruguay; on the west by the Paraná; on the south by the Rio Agupay and province of Corrientes. The distance as the crow flies is 500 miles from the Agupay due northward to the falls of Guayra, the Brazilian frontier intervening. The country is undulating, thickly wooded, and traversed by numberless tributaries of the Uruguay and Paraná. The Pequiry-guazu, near the 25th parallel of south latitude, is the frontier line

MONTEVIDEAN LETTER.

June 30th. Owing to the brokers having had nothing to stir them up during the last two days, being 'dias de fiesta,' I suppose, that accounts for the heavy sales of Denda Interna to-day and also of Denda Extraordinaria and Fomento Territorial shares. The sales altogether have been:—

The Bolsa was pretty lively during the official hours, but nothing of importance occurred, as the liquidation for the end of the month only takes place on the 2nd July; Mr. William

Rose, the champion 'hammer thrower,' both here and in Buenos Ayres, being the liquidator.

Its a pity the steamers do not bring this amount every day, so as to influence the rate of discounts which is still the same as my last; to-day the Banks have been very chary of discounting, and only very few amounts have been done. Exchange for the Minho has been done from 50 1/2 to 51 d, and about £100,000 has been opened for her; at this rate the market closes flat.

In imports nothing has been done to-day as all the merchants have been too busy with their packet work, to be able to receive customers.

Since the last three days about twenty vessels have entered the port, but none of them bring any cargoes of importance worth mentioning.

In produce nothing at all has been done and for at least a month I do not expect any movement in it.

On Sunday the elections for three members of the 'Junta Economica' was to have taken place according to the Government decree, but as the 'Alcalde Ordinario' did not have his books ready, it has been put off for another month.

People have been rather flustered with a rumor of the Brazilians having bombarded the town of Alvear, the news requires confirmation, but as the knowing ones are silent I have been unable to find out anything certain.

Our Import Market during the month of June has been dull and sales limited to a great measure to sales for town consumption and small invoices for the river towns. This is not to be surprised at, for during the present winter season it is expected; the heavy rains during the month have almost impeded traffic to the Interior, altogether our trade with the camp will be subject to the clerk of the weather until the Central Uruguay Railway Co. lower their cargo tariff which at present is too high and consequently only used as a necessity. On the other hand the ticklish state of our money market obliges all dealers, wholesale and retail, to be very cautious not to enter into heavy compromises, this combined with the constant steamer conveyance for goods, stops all chances of speculation in imports to be lucrative.

Cardiff coals are dull, and \$7.13 may be considered value for delivery here; two cargoes arrived to-day.

Cadiz salt may be said to be out of season, and saladeros will probably have sufficient stock over this season to commence the next one with.

Lumber for consumption is dull, our dealers being well supplied with the large purchases during the past six months. For one or two small cargoes of white pine an outlet would be readily found for transhipment to the small river towns at \$5.51, and perhaps \$5.52; but if shipments during the St. Laurence season (we hear the ice broke up about middle of May) are made on the same scale as last, we may expect lower prices even than last season. However, shippers having received a severe lesson in the way of losses, it is probable that shipments during the coming season will be reduced by one-half, in which case prices may possibly be maintained, but I do not think prices will advance in any case as stocks are large and consumption reduced.

Pitch Pine is in about the same position as white, although owing to the low value, consumption of this kind has increased, but stocks are also very considerable. We quote \$4.42 to \$4.44 mil on board.

Spruce is neglected and dealers over supplied; two cargoes deposited for account of importers six months ago, are offering and probably \$1.37 to 33 will be the value.

Refined Sugar is dull and prices have not changed during the month; stock is about 7,000 barrels, but mostly damp. For a dry good article I believe the following prices would be obtained—

American, 18 lbs. tuertes in bond, Havre, 16 1/2 do. Dutch, 16 1/2 do.

Rice, owing to several arrivals during the month: the price has been weak, but stock being reduced I consider the following obtainable—

Java, East India, 18 1/2 arr. in bond. Italian, Giaco, 18 5/8 arr. duty paid. Spirits in casks are again a shade firmer, stock in first hands having been sold at the following prices:—

German, French, \$90 pipe in bond. American, \$95 do. do.

Hamburg articles are scarce, and saleable at following rates:—

Gin, demijohns, 18 10 in bond. Do, boxes, 18 30 do. Spirits, do 5 gal, 38. Do, do 1 gal, 18.

Wine.—Owing to the splendid crop in France, the article 'Budeos' has a downward tendency. Spanish wine is firm at \$60, duty paid, per pipe for good marks.

Kerosene—Shipments to B. Ayres have reduced stock to 9,000 boxes; the article is selling in small lots at 27c per gallon on board.

Flour—The native article of good quality is worth \$1.10 arroba. Several

lots arrived from Chile have been forwarded to your market.

Maiz—For shipment to Brazil has been sold up to \$2.80 faanga, including bag, delivered on the wharf.

Provisions are dull, more especially cheese and hams of all kinds, our market being unstocked.

Produce—Stock in our barracas is very small, as usual at this season, dry hides being the principal article in stock; prices of this article for the United States, notwithstanding the unfavorable news, continue firm, with buyers at \$8.20, duty paid.

Sales of saladero produce have been small, and the saladeristas will have enough work to fulfill the previous contracts. Prices here are without change. Judging from the late news from Europe, buyers here this season will find they have paid too high for salted hides. I believe the tallow shipments will pay, prices paid here being comparatively low.

Of wool there is no stock here, but opening prices at the coming season are likely to be high if last European quotations can be taken as a criticism; this is good for the country, and I trust \$5 will be paid.

Sheepskins are eagerly sought after, but until next month arrivals will consist of inferior skins; for full wool skins I believe 15 1/2 to 16 r. ft. will be paid.

Bones and bone ash had improved according to last news from Europe; 1,000 tons are now offering here, and probably \$18 will now be paid for it.

Exchange is weak; still as remittances to be made cannot be heavy, rate will probably be maintained at 51d for Commercial bills; banks ask 50 1/2. I have been unable to ascertain amount of specie shipped per Minho, but believe amount will not exceed \$25,000.

I just hear of the following transactions, which are of interest—

110 mil feet pitch pine, ex Aeolus, at \$4.44.

Charter of barque Guillerma to load bone-ash and bones for Great Britain at 22s. 6d. and 5 per cent.

It is said that Messrs. Humphreys & Clarke have dissolved partnership to-day, their contract having expired.

PARIS LETTER.

(From our own Correspondent.)

May 17th. If politics be not very clear, politicians are beyond question waxing terribly warm. It will be a mercy if the Assembly allow perspiring deputies to cool themselves by a few stirring debates, which will act like blood-letting. Not a single person can foretell the important events that the next session is destined to grapple with; the unexpected proves ever too much of a certainty for any prophet to risk a reputation. The cardinal fact is, that the people are not afflicted with the fever which consumes deputies and publicists, they know the waiting game is theirs, and that the President will allow no party to give an unfair blow to France.

The Bonapartists are in a terrible state of alarm because the Comte de Chambord is rumored to have re-entered France. The nation does not agree with their view, that the end of the world is nigh because the country counts one citizen more. This very indifference ought not to escape the careful attention of the count's advisers and partisans; before he can arrive at the throne Henri V. would have to convert nearly 30,000,000 of people to see in him their guide, philosopher, and friend. He possesses no majority in the Chamber no more than in the country—so that he is not an apparition to frighten the timid into making their wills. It is not clear that any difficulty would be placed in the way of the Prince Imperial's return to this country, unless he adopted the Boulogne and Strasbourg routes 'à la mode' his papa. Thiers committed a blunder in ordering Prince Napoleon out of France, and however few may have been the successes of the present government, they merit every praise for allowing the prince to live in France, and to demonstrate his intuity. Let all pretenders take their walks abroad, and read in the scolding eyes of the inhabitants a "don't you wish you may get us?"

France has recovered from the shock caused by one of her sovereign deputies making a post-prandial aspiration for his native Nice to be soon reunited to Italy. This ex-Italian, M. Piccon, is a plebeian Frenchman, very forgetful of his duty towards his selected country, and of the honorable trust confided to him as a representative. Without going as far back as the Fall of Man, or to the Gallo-Roman period, to prove the Nicois are as much Italians as the Marseillais, it is beyond doubt France has fulfilled every legal obligation in accepting the annexation of Nice as indemnity for her aid given to Italy. Every nation has a weakness for material guarantees; it is in part their vocation to keep a look out for such.

"Hal, 'tis no sin for a man to labour in his vocation."

Italy made a good investment by her military alliance with France, and did not pay excessively for the aid. It would be well were Bismarck to observe as much of moderation in his annexations, which have an uncommon resemblance to Rob Roy's observance of the Decalogue. France has proved over sensitive respecting Deputy Piccon's light heart.

The new Postmaster-General is really the hopes expected from him a freer promotion. He is becoming a freer trader in letters; he has succeeded in negotiating a postal treaty with Russia, and is in a fair way of effecting

the same with the United States.

Much allowance must be made for France in her efforts to find corn in Egypt. It was Thiers himself, excellent statesman in other respects, that believed the foreigner could not be too highly taxed. But the foreigner slipped through his hands; covetousness burst the bag. Nowhere is this more palpable than in the case of the post-office, an institution that all French Governments never view as other thing but a monopoly for making money. The postal cards have proved a failure; the experiment never had a fair trial, and the scheme is down for interment at any early day. Inland postage is too high, and the tariff is condemned by naturally reduced receipts. But in the case of foreign postage the diminution on the year has been three-quarters of a million of francs, or nearly half a million on the first quarter of the present year. These figures apply to foreign postage alone. The fact is, persons with a large correspondence devote their attention how to transmit their letters under cover to London, Brussels or Geneva, to be re-expedited. One gentleman asserts he can by this means economize as much as 70 per cent. It would pay some firms to salary an employee outside France to re-post their foreign letters. The Government is well aware of this. Respecting the revenue generally, the quarterly returns just published indicate a slight falling off in the receipts, and that it is hopeless to expect anything more from an increase of the indirect taxes. New sources of revenue must be discovered, or the direct imposts increased. The latter is almost a virgin source of revenue, and the alacrity, almost the pleasure, with which personal taxes in this country are paid must ever act as a 'sursum corda' for a perplexed Finance Minister.

French Protestants are anything but a happy family at the present moment: at no time were they, of late especially; a united one. Since the Calvinists, forming 63 per cent of the total, have been legally recognised as the orthodox Reformed Church, all outside their religious charter—belief in the divinity of Jesus Christ, and acceptance of the Bible as the rule of faith—are excluded from State recognition.
