form; to settle our territory; to borrow from the most advanced nations the best political model that will lead us to the proper level.

Whoever settles in a country like ours accepts ipso facto the danger he may have to encounter, and cannot count on more protection from the Government than we can reasonably give.

But in the picture of Mr. MacDonell's reclamations he shows only the gloomy side that, in more or less degree, exists in all the phases of human life.

Our Executive is only one of the three powers mutually independent which exist in every civilized community; consequently we cannot interfere with the judicial or legislative powers, by calling for an extraordinary proceeding or a special law for the case in question; nor can any constitutional Government be asked to do anything outside the sphere of its Constitution.

Mr. MacDonell forgot in dealing with our Government the diplomatic rule followed by Great Britain towards all nations; he advanced charges unproven, and attributed to us motives that had no origin but his own prejudices, probably of the same kind as made his mission a 'fiasco' with the Argentine Government.

Either Great Britain considers us an independent and civilized nation, and then its proceedings and even demands should be regulated according to the Law of Nations; or she considers us in an undefined position, and then we are not responsible for our acts.

It is necessary to define the basis of our relations if we would prevent in future a revival of these difficulties. If the Oriental Republic is responsible for its acts it is entitled by the Law of Nations to all the rights possessed by other countries. In this manner we may advance a reclamation for the offence done us by your representative, especially in his notes of Nov. 13th and January 5th 1871.

social and political life in Banda Oriental lies in the effort to root out old prejudices and evil habits, to re-

merely carried away by undue zeal when he made such charges against us. I am therefore authorized to propose this solution, so as to restore friendly relations and enter peacefully, to our mutual advantage, on an amicable footing.

1. Both Governments recognize that the first prerogative of a free nation is to settle its internal affairs as it may judge best, without interfering directly or indirectly in the affairs of its neighbor; and that no reclamation is admissible unless when the political acts of a country offend or injure the general interests of another country.

2. That this principle of non-interference is infringed when a nation pretends to interpret the administrative acts of another that are of a purely internal character.

3. That the subjects of either cannot expect in the other any more protection than the laws give to the inhabitants in general, but must support public calamities the same as anybody else.

4. That the subject of one country going to reside in another is amenable to the laws, good or bad as they may be, and can never claim indemnities on this score.

5. That misfortunes caused by war or the like can never be made a motive of reclamation for indemnity.

6. That the subject of one country going to the other accepts the social and political condition, recognizes himself as temporarily subject to its laws, while remaining there, and is outside the jurisdiction of his Consuls.

7. That Consuls in either country shall merely be charged to see that their countrymen are not worse treated than people of other nationalities.

disposable before any such renewal. Your Memorandum contains some elementary axioms and principles laid down as a guide for Her Majesty's Government in future relations with the Government of Uruguay.

Upon this I may observe that the policy of Great Britain being in general regulated according to the doctrines of international law and the faithful observance of treaties it is as unnecessary as it would be undignified for Her Majesty's Government to enter into relations with this or that country, making declarations such as those proposed.

The acceptance of these rules appears in your Memorandum as the condition, whereon your Government proposes the renewal of friendly relations with this country; and you have done me the honor to say that if they have accepted the Government of Uruguay would be ready to overlook as an excess of zeal all the representations which Mr. MacDonell felt it his duty to make in favor of British subjects, and that Her Majesty's Government would thus secure the indisputable advantage of not occupying its time in details of reclamations that you were sure would never receive attention.

With respect to Mr. MacDonell it is my duty, sir, to express clearly to you that, far from censuring the conduct of that gentleman, Her Majesty's Government approves and has always approved the manner in which he fulfilled his instructions, and that it is impossible to see in your Memorandum anything to call in doubt the just motives for such approval.

Her Majesty's Government does not demand, never has demanded, exceptional treatment for British subjects in Uruguay, or of the causes that led to a rupture of diplomatic relations.

These conditions are indispensable for the maintenance of friendly relations between independent States; and it is my most fervent desire that as soon as you convey this to your Government you may be enabled to fulfill the object of your mission and ensure to this country and your own the advantages of mutual confidence and friendly dealings.

Her Majesty's Government has also a right to demand that our Ministers and Consuls be received with the respect and attention accorded them in other civilized countries.

Among the works of semi-political character which have aroused public attention since the appearance of Uncle Tom's Cabin few surpass in interest the story of Max Havelaar, translated into English by Mr. Alphonse Nannys, a gentleman at present residing in the Argentine Republic. The London papers, reviewed this book in the most flattering manner, and it possesses at the present moment additional interest from the fact that the Dutch are engaged in a life or death struggle for the possession of the colonies of Batavia where the scene of the story is laid.

ST. PATRICK'S SOCIETY.

Yesterday, at two o'clock, a meeting was held of this society at its Reading-rooms, to receive the petition to Government drawn up by Dr. Lopez: Mr. TROS. ARMSTRONG in the chair.

Dr. J. F. Lopez read the petition in Spanish, and explained the points which the paper touched on. He considered the conduct of the Irishmen in the Plate, coming forward to demand of Government some steps towards camp reform, a good sign, and only hoped to see his countrymen in the camp follow the same course.

The Chairman suggested that the petition remain on the table of the rooms for a week or ten days.

Mr. Casey stated that he had sent circulars to all the directors, and he hoped that every director would write to him and give him authority to sign same.

The chairman said that it was with the greatest pleasure he had to inform the meeting of the great increase of Irish emigration to the Plate. Within the last 20 days over 250 Irish emigrants, male and female, had arrived. This fact spoke volumes (cheers).

Mr. Thomas Duggan moved, and Mr. Mullhall seconded, a vote of thanks to Dr. Lopez for his kindness in drawing up the petition to the Governor, and his great attention in coming today to express his views on same. Passed unanimously.

The steamer Saturno, Captain Magnasco, arrived this morning from your port and Salto; and brought down 135 passengers. The long list of passengers may be easily accounted for by our having two teat days in succession; she also brought \$1300 in gold to Belmont. This steamer returns to Buenos Aires tomorrow to your port, but will probably have but few passengers, as many will remain here till Monday next.

The inauguration of the opening of the Central Uruguay Railway to Durazno will probably not take place, and in fact I do not see why it should, as now that the line has been open to traffic for some days past, I do not see the necessity of going to the extra expense a public inauguration would naturally entail on the company.

The recent hurricane in Alagoas, Brazil, is described as the most terrific commotion of the elements ever seen in those parts.

There was a general flare-up at the Mount last week, in consequence of Ristori leaving quite suddenly for Chile in the Britannia without giving the full complement of performances she had announced.

They have got the Bad Sovereign in Asuncion now. The general opinion up there is that the imitation is magnificent, and that it would be a fine thing for the country if they had a few millions of them.

Cremation is making wonderful strides in Germany. The etiquette there now is for the male head of the bereaved family to send out cards of invitation to the funeral baked meats, stating that on such a day at such an hour he requests the attendance of his friends to assist him in the melancholy duty of burning his mother-in-law, or other dear relative.

that Congress had passed the Caleras Railway. The enterprise is of great importance to Cordoba, indeed to the whole country, as Cordoba line, the best by far in the Republic, will come into general use everywhere, instead of the poor stails that can now compete with it.

Nothing fresh from old Rosary, except that the Deliberative Council has approved Mr. Rigoni's Water Works scheme. The works are to be commenced in five months, and finished in a year.

Mr. Best's funeral yesterday was attended by a large number of English and other merchants, as well as by many of the leading Argentine citizens, and a number of friends who had come up from Montevideo.

We understand that the Financero Minister is engaged in active measures for the improvement of the Boca. It is proposed to open a new channel by dredging 200,000 cubic metres south of the present channel.

We had a letter from Ajo yesterday. An inch and a half of rain fell there on the 31st ultimo, and improved the camps very much, yet cattle are still suffering very much. It is next to impossible to get anything carted, as before the end of the journey half the bullock team is generally ready for skinning.

Our nice little colleague the Prensa de Belgrano has now "Capital question" on the brain in almost as alarming a degree as its Rosario brother of the press. Half its last issue is taken up with the question: As we said before, Mr. Bouvard Bravo's mammoth scheme knocks all chance for Flores, Quiñes, Belgrano, Billy Maria, Rosario, or Cordoba on the head for ever.

El Catolico Argentino is the name of a new paper which is announced to appear on the 1st prox. The 'Bus' is fearfully overcrowded as it is, and where the new comer is to find a seat we really are at a loss to say.

Death seldom appears anywhere without bringing with it some sorrow for some heart and tears for some eyes. Professor Murray was not an old man, but his short life was not spent in illness, and the number and value of his works sufficed to have adorned and to have benefited an eminently useful and good old age.

It is with unfeigned regret that we have to chronicle the death of Mr. Charles Murray, so well-known in our small English community. This melancholy event occurred at 7 a.m. yesterday at his residence, No. 4971 Calle Cuyo.

The deceased gentleman occupied a distinguished place in the scientific world. He had been for several years Professor of Pharmacy at the Faculty of Medicine in this city. He was connected with the Paleontological Society of Buenos Ayres, and Honorary Member of various Literary and Scientific Societies in Europe.

For a considerable time Mr. Murray was editor of the "Buenos Ayres Pharmaceutical Journal," but he owes his chief literary fame to his work on Pharmacy, which is universally held to be a masterpiece of research and execution, and which has been generally accepted as such by our Faculty of Medicine.
