The city of B. Ayres was thrown into consternation on Monday evening by the news that a band of assassins had broken into the house of Mr. Anacarsis Lanus...

The sensational horror that has seized everybody in our city can hardly be imagined by people not actually in B. Ayres. Day after day for the last six months we have heard of some fresh murder or outrage...

It seems that when two of the assassins entered the house by the principal staircase three others, also wearing ponchos, broke into a stable at the rear of the house and climbed into the yard adjoining Mr. Lanus's kitchen...

It is impossible to describe the horror and alarm of Mrs. Lanus and her daughters. The tragedy has caused an unparalleled sensation through all circles in our city.

Some days ago, as the Republic states, a Spaniard waited on Mr. Lanus, asking for pecuniary assistance as he had to make a journey, to which Mr. Lanus replied that he would subscribe when his visitor had got some other names on the list.

The letters in question were sent by Mr. Lanus to the Chief of Police, who tried to discover the criminal, and meantime put a police-guard to protect Mr. Lanus's house.

After the outrage became known through town over 100 gentlemen, armed with revolvers, repaired to Mr. Lanus's house to protect and assure his family.

SYMPATHY FOR MR. LANUS.

The merchants of Buenos Ayres, native and foreign, held a meeting yesterday to congratulate Mr. Anacarsis Lanus and his family on their happy escape from the band of assassins who broke into his house on Monday evening.

The Spanish Finance Minister, Camacho, says he has been offered by foreign banks a loan of £2 millions.

The French Government has appointed a Committee of M.M. Kleitz, Dröjling, Kolb, Lalanne, Soich, Forcay, Roche, Lapparent and Admiral Fiquet to report on the proposed tunnel between England and France.

The Count de Chambord sent a congratulatory telegram from Frohsdorf to the Duc de Rochefoucauld, who says he will now assume the head of the Legitimist party in France.

The Figaro and Journal de France are being prosecuted for having reproduced some of Rochefort's articles in the New York papers.

M. Curcier, a money-changer of Bordeaux, eloped last week with a million francs, the Tribunal of Commerce at once sent orders to pursue him.

New York advices, June 18th, say that Guzales, the Guatemalan scoundrel, is sentenced to be shot.

An Imperial Government messenger from the Russian embassy at Peking was recently found frozen to death and half buried in sand on his way to Kiachit.
