On the heels of this agreeable export news come the unpleasant announcement of 2 very heavy failures to-day in this market, one an aluminium firm with liabilities for 9 millions, and the other a house in a smaller way and lesser liabilities.

Mr. A. Smithers, the Secretary and manager of the London and River Plate Bank in London, was very warmly welcomed on 'Change to-day. Everyone seemed glad to see him back again in B. Ayres, after a five years absence, and he positively looks younger than the day he left the Plate, so many years ago.

It was announced on 'Change to-day that Mr. Newman, the co-contractor for the City Improvement Work, leaves shortly for Europe on business of importance.

The news from Montevideo about the loan is not at all fresh in this market, and holders of the Deuda Interna, unless they can recoup by a purchase of the new bonds at a very low figure may find it difficult to get rid of the old stock without loss. It appears that there are no holders of Deuda Interna in this market, and many parties hold on to the last in the hope of something of the London loan being done, and this dream is fast becoming a reality, and the best thing for holders now to do is to hold on to the lot for another year or so, as in these countries depression in anything is never permanent. It is clear from the tenor of the diplomatic notes exchanged, and which we published last Sunday, that there is no probability of friendly relations being resumed between Great Britain and the Montevideo Government for some time; and how the Montevideo Government will cope with the small amount of the London market, with all the things that are at present stall at the Foreign Office, is really most extraordinary. These diplomatic notes reveal everything, and the Montevideo Government was not very fastidious in throwing up this London loan bill 'in toto' for the present.

To-day was another very dull day in the market; brokers complain that there is nothing whatever doing; discourses say that first-class bills are very scarce, and only in exchange there is a good movement. The London outrage still weighs on the market; the stock is a sorrow one and it is hoped will fall to some extent. All parties admit that the present state of things cannot last much longer.

To-day we have a visit from a sheep farmer of Arica, who informs us that some of the millers at Arica in the north have commenced working, and that there have been large sales of capons up there at 1 1/2 and 1, and the capons are good, and just ready for export. This is the best news we have had from the camp for many months.

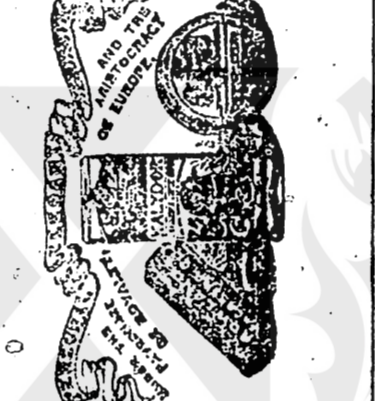

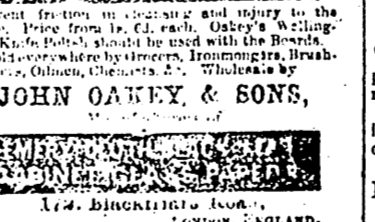

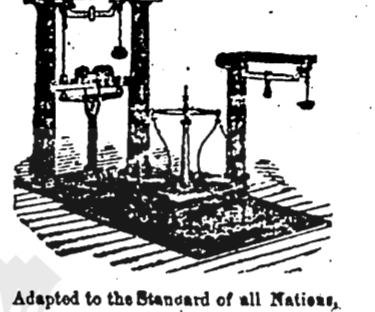
