The money market continues to improve, and Cedulas, like Consols in London, show the improvement. In other branches, however, the improvement is equally apparent. There are those of course who deny that things are any better, but as we will try to show that the sun shines money is somewhat easier in every circle. The Provincial Bank discounted yesterday 91 millions, and one of our private banks has suddenly unlocked the keys of its strong room and discounted since Sunday some 300,000 patacones; bills that matured to-day and that for the last year or so have been renewed were paid in full. A very heavy failure, native dealer, was announced today, but the assets are large and perhaps sufficient to cover everything. Whatever failures occur now will serve but to improve the market, as they will rid discounters of the same bills which are hawked about and tend to keep interests above legitimate business rates.

The loss of the steamer Curumba was disastrous news received to-day from Montevideo; she took a large bow full of telegrams for Europe, the senders now call for the return of their money, of course it will be at once refunded if the passengers are lost.

There was the same usual hub-bub to-day about the Provincial Bank exchange, until to-morrow the Bank would not say how much it will draw, and many exasperated takers withdrew their applications in presence of so unbusiness-like a proceeding.

Exchange cannot be quoted higher than 48 1/2, although in the morning something was passed at 48 1/2. The Cedula market topped to-day at 82; the rate was too sudden for the speculators, prices fell off during business hours, but stiffened again in the liquidation room.

The sale of a cargo of salted hides was reported to-day at 61 1/2; the vessel has already sailed. The splendid Lampari & Holt steamer Leibnitz is looked for to-morrow; she will bring dates to 3rd July. Mr. Barraquero Durand in his circular for the mail gives the following:— Wool arrivals for fortnight 15,000 ar., stock 105,000 ar., total receipts to date 4,200,000 ar., sales 1,095,000 ar., against arrivals 3,810,000 ar., 3,420,000 ar. sales, and 420 ar. stock same time last year.

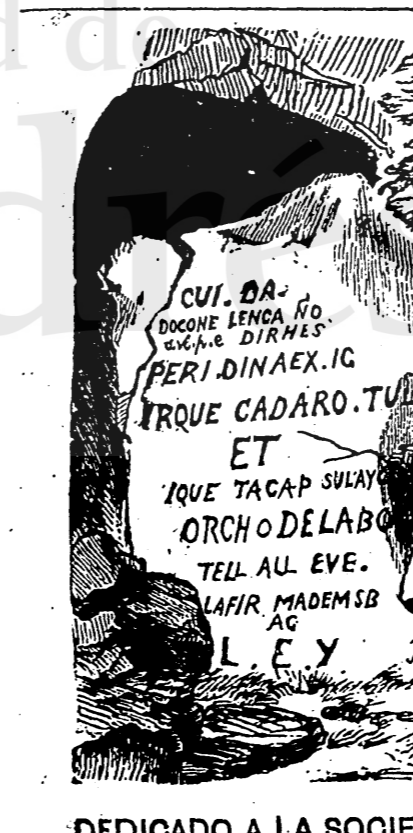
