RIGONI'S PORT SCHEME. Congress has sent before committee

Dr. Rigoni presented his project in 1872, in the form of a pamphiet with the usual plans and engravings. He nance of parochial Constables. endeavors to shew by numerous arguments that the Boca and Ensenada are unsuitable, also that Bateman's deep-water channel for 13 miles is utterly impracticable and if made would

be useless. He chooses a bank called Banco de la Ciudad, 3 miles in a straight line from the Retiro terminus, where there is a constant depth of 164 feet of water, and proposes to construct on said bank a wall of masonry like a circular forfress; this harbor to be connected with

running the whole length. The mode of constructing the harbor vould be after this manner. A steamer specially constructed for the pur pose would begin by lowering a large iron box which would be pumped empty, then the ground excavated some 3½ feet for the foundations, and lastly blocks of concrete let down one beside another just like bricks; in this manner two such vessels could lay 70 lineal situate at Almagro, forty squares from the feet daily and the whole circular wall would completed in 6 months. This seems to us the identical system invented by Mr. Stoney, the well-known engineer of the Dublin Harbor committee, an invention that has caused much noise in the scientific world, and which Dr. Rigoni has perhaps personal-

The project supposes 280 working days in the year, and 146 stages or piers for vessels to load at or discharge each stage doing service daily for 18 tons; this gives 1,471,680 tons yearly, besides 630,000 tons that could be done at the outer wharf; in all 2,101,680 tons, whereas the total loading and discharge of our port in 1871 was estimated at only 800,000 tons. The whole traffic of the port would only require two peons at each stage, say 292 men, the railway taking the merchandize along the pier to the Gashouse, for transit by rail to the country, or by carts to the mercantile houses in town. The method looks very simple, and in every way feasible, would be much less than Bateman's.

Bateman's excavations, he says, amount to 9,287,509 cubic metres, while Rigoni's do not exceed 600,000. Bateman holds out the bait of gaining from the river a large area of ground, that will realize great part of the cost. Rigoni says such gain is artificial, as B. Ayres has plenty of room to expand west, north or southward, with. out building on an unhealthy site, similar to that which was the focus of yellow-fever at Montevideo in 1857.

EBSWORTHS Y. THE ALLIANCE MARINE INSURANCE COMPANY. "This case raised a novel and difficult question as to mercantile insurance, in which the Court of Common Pleas had been equally divided. The question was as to the power of a merchant in this country to recover the whole amount and value of goods consigned to him by correspondents abroad in which they are partly interested. The plaintiffs, a tirm of merchants in Lordon, were in the habit of receiving consignments of cotton from correspondents abroad, and, among others, f.om a firm at Bombay, making advance thereon by their acceptan es. For the purpos vances thereon, they effected with the company what are called "op n policies" (that is, policies not naming the ships or goods to be insured), each policy being for £5,000 on "cotton," "from B mb y to London," "by ship or ships;" and at the plaintiffs received advices of shipments from their correspondents they "declared" the particular shipments to be covered by the policies On the 29th of April, 1870, the Bombay firm advised the plaintiffs of the shipment of 250 bales of cotton on board a particular ship, and of their having drawn on the plaintiffs for £3,000 at six months sight, on account of the shipment, and requesting them to insurthe shipment. The bill was negotiated through the National Bank of India, the "shipping documents" (bi'l of lading, &c.) being I dged as security. The bill of exchange being transmitted by the bank was accepted by the plaintiff .- against delivery of shipping docum nts'-for the cotton. T e plaintiffs ther declared the cotton valued at £5,000, on two of the open policies they then had running with the company, and they directed the bank to retain the amount insured at their disposal until payment of the bil. Soon afterwards the ship containing the cotton was lost at sea, and the cetton was wholly lest. The plaintiffs paid the bill of exchange, and received t e b ll of lading for the cotton, and they then sued upon the policies to recover the full value of the cotion insured, al-


