

PATAGONIAN EXPLORATIONS

Messrs. Moreno and Berg, which left B. Avres on the 21st, ult., is probably ascending the Santa Cruz river to its sources in the Andes. Mr. Moreno has already earned an European reputation by his discoveries of pre-historic Patagonian remains; he is accompanied by Dr. Berg, late Director of the Mu-colors. seum of Riga; their escort consists of ten men armed with Remington rifles. and they take also provisions for the road, their proposed line of march being across the Patagonian wilds to the Tronador volcano, whence a pass of the Cordillera will enable them to reach Valdivia, returning by Pacific Company's steamer to the River Plate early in 1875. The entire cost of the expedition is defrayed by themselves, showing their devotion to the cause of science, irrespective of the great danger inseparable from so daring a jour-

ney. We may remind our readers that a similar expedition took place in February 1873 under the gallant Col. in a steamer of the same name, as high as the island of Choelechoel. His neers, 3 sailors and 3 soldiers, besides

Numerous dangers and difficulties beset the expedition. At one place they had to leave the steamer, and carry a canoe with them on a waggon, until they came to a dense wood where

It was the 4th of August when Guerrico and his little party reached the island of Choelechoel, where Rosas had proposed establishing a settlement, as it is the key of the Negro and Colorado territory. Guerrico took soundings with a raft, and made plans of the island and fords of the river, but the raft was capsized while being towed by an Indian swimmer, and provisions and supplies were lost, although happily no lives. Still undaunted, Querrico pushed further up the Negro, some 5 leagues higher than Choele choel. Unluckily some disagreement occurred with the Indians. Rodriguez was captured, with an accordeon, on which the savages made him play all night, putting him cruelly to death ing his corpse. 
