

The mortgage Bank pays the interest on the quarterly cedrlas or mortgage certificates between the 31st Docember and 6th January, the 31st March and 6th April, the 30th June and 6th July, the 30th September and 6th June and 6th July, the 30th September and 6th October every year, and on the half yearly cedulas from the 31st Docember to 6th January, and from 30th June to 6th July.

The Mortgage Bank can act between the capitalist and mortgager, free of charge in the way of realizing the cedulas, and for this purpose will received aposite without interest, which will receive a preference, and which sums will be deposited in the Provincial Bank.

On and after the 16th Fobruary 1872, the Mortgage Bank will be open to the public.
