

The greater number of our ancient national monuments were erected hundreds of years before the landing of the Danes in Ireland." Just such a popular and erroneous idea as this existedkin Peru with reference to the greaf works there being accredited to the Incas, whereas they were daily finding out that they were creeted, like the Irish forts and mounds, hundreds if not thousands of years before there was an Inca in the land. He added that the process of inhumation used in pre-historic times in Ireland seemed to have been the same as in Peru.

XVII. That Subscribers shall have the privilege of recommending one In-patient annually for every \$50ft. of annual subscription, such patient to be free or all charges, and that a patient so recommended shall be admitted on presentation of the letter of admission furnished to such Subscribers by the Secre ary to the Hospital.

XVIII. That all accidents, cases of poisoning and other urgent cases be admitted at any time without an official order at the discretion of the Medical Officer or House Surgeon.

XIX. That an order from the British Comsult, the Chaplains serving on the Committee, or the Visiting Medical Officers, guaranteeing the poverty of the applicant, be sufficient to procure him admission, subject to such arrangements to the Committee from time to time may direct.

X.X. That, so far as the Hospiial accommodation all permit, other patients be received in payment of such a daily remunerative rate as as a 1 be fixed by the Committee.
